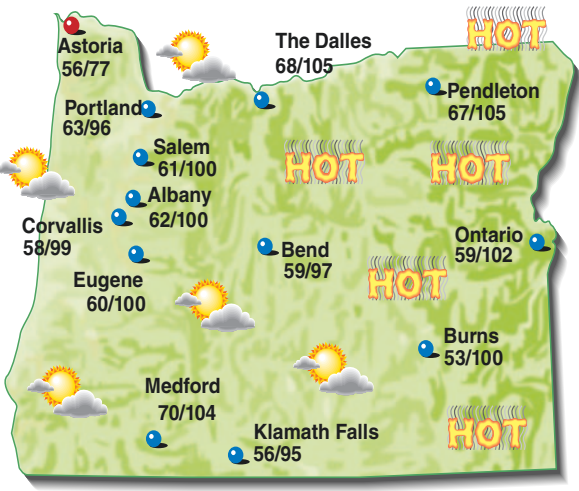

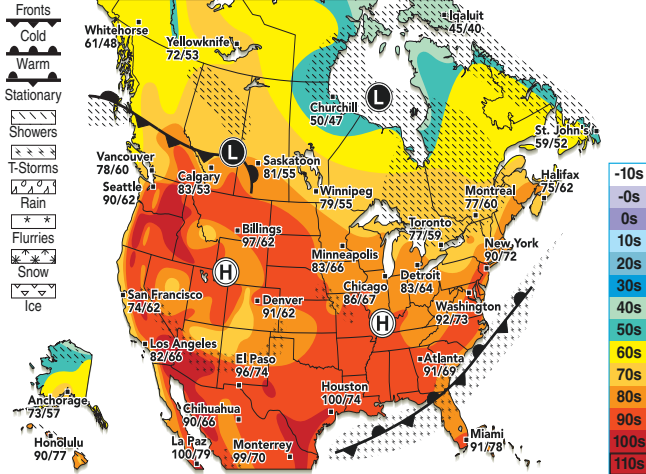

Coast Guard recognized with stamp

ILWACO, Wash. — The U.S. Coast Guard will be recognized Tuesday with a Forever stamp that depicts an oil painting of the cutter Eagle and an MH-65 Dolphin helicopter.

The cutter is the Coast Guard's three-masted sailing ship and the Dolphin is a signature rescue helicopter.

The painting is by William S. Phillips, an artist who lives in Ashland.

The U.S. Postal Service issues Forever stamps to help consumers handle price changes. The stamps, which hold the value of first-class one ounce stamps, have also been used to honor historical events, great personalities and lasting insti-

On Tuesday, to mark the issuance, the Ilwaco Post Office will offer collectors hand cancellations with a pictorial

hand stamp designed by Don Nisbett, a local artist.

Collectors can bring mail to the pavilion at the Port of Ilwaco between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m.

The Great Columbia Crossing 10K run/walk across the Astoria Bridge takes place Oct. 11, and registration is now open.

The event is an Official USA Track & Field Certified Event. Runners will be timed with an electronic chip and will be given a separate start time from walkers.

Participants are required to register in advance, and registration will close when the event reaches capacity of 3,500 participants.

Crossing is produced by the Astoria-Warrenton Area Chamber of Commerce, and sponsored by the Columbia Memorial Hospital Cardiology Clinic, a CMH/Oregon Health and Science University collaboration.

The cost to register is \$40, or \$45 with electronic timing. Long-sleeved T-shirts cost \$16 and up. Registration includes:
