ASTORIA — The Astoria Regatta, a traditional local festival full of fun family events, runs Aug. 5 to 9.

"Rockin' on the River" is the theme for this year's annual celebration, which started in 1894 and has been designated a Historic Cultural Tradition by the Oregon State Historic Commission.

The festivities continue Saturday, Aug. 8. The Moose Lodge will host a pancake breakfast at 8 a.m.

At 9:30 a.m. at the Flavel House Museum Garden, watch the Regatta Court help the new queen plant roses at the Royal Rosarian Rose Planting Ceremony. This event is free.

Explore the rich history of the festival with "Regatta Through the Years," a special display at the Clatsop County Heritage Museum. See it from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday and Sunday. Admission is \$4 for adults and \$2 for children.

Saturday at noon sees the event everyone looks forward to: the Grand Land Parade in downtown Astoria, led by Grand Marshall Willis Van Dusen. Enjoy floats, cars, walkers, candy and entertainers along the loop of Exchange and Duane streets.

Before and after the parade, from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m., enjoy a free Regatta barbecue, beer garden, live entertainment and a kid's fun zone in Heritage Square, located at 12th and Duane streets.

Food includes salmon, ribs, hamburgers and hot dogs. The beer garden will serve beers from local and national breweries. The kid's fun zone will feature games, a bouncy house and more. There will also be a special celebration at 3 p.m. for former mayor and parade Grand Marshall Willis Van Dusen; the city of Astoria will provide cake. Also be sure to shop at the Regatta Sidewalk Faire at downtown merchants, organized by the Astoria Downtown Historic District Association.

The Astoria Yacht Club will hold its annual Regatta Sailboat Races all week. On Saturday, view the races east of the Astoria Bridge toward the Columbia River Maritime Museum. Sunday's races will be held west of the bridge.

You can also see the Highwater Boat Parade at 5:30 p.m. Saturday. Gather at the Columbia River Maritime Museum for this free event. Following the parade, there will be a reception at the West End Mooring Basin to give awards in different categories to boat parade participants.

After the awards, find your favorite spot to view the spectacular fireworks show over the Columbia River at dusk.

On Sunday, the Astoria Yacht Club will host the annual Ducky Derby at 11:30 a.m. Root for your ducky to win prizes at this free event, held at the West End Mooring Basin. The Columbia River Symphony will present a special free "Rockin' Regatta's Summer Pops" concert at 3 p.m. at Astoria High School to close out festivities.
