



E. Oregon blaze tops 80 square miles

PORTLAND — A wildfire that destroyed three dozen homes in Eastern Oregon has expanded to 84 square miles and more people have been told to evacuate.

But after a week of burning out of control, the Canyon Creek Complex

fire south of John Day is now 10 percent contained.

Officials say northwest winds Thursday afternoon may increase fire activity and more people have been ordered to evacuate.

A community meeting is scheduled for 5 p.m. at Grant Union High School's old gym.

Lightning started the fire Aug. 12. Though home-threatening wildfires are a fact of life each summer, no Oregon wildfire since the Great Depression has destroyed more houses.

Another 10 major wildfires are raging in Oregon, and Gov. Kate Brown is deploying National Guard troops to help.
