## Bonamici to stop in Warrenton for town hall

U.S. Rep. Suzanne Bonamici will visit Warrenton as part of a six-city town hall tour.

Bonamici, D-Ore., will visit the Warrenton Community Center from 1:30 to 2:30 p.m. Sept. 13. The center is located at 170 S.W. Third St.

The congresswoman will hold six town hall meetings during the next three weeks to hear from constituents and to discuss her work in Oregon and in Washington, D.C. "It's critical that I hear from my constituents about issues affecting them," Bonamici said in a release Thursday. "These town

hall meetings provide me with a useful perspective that informs my work. I always appreciate hearing from my constituents about their ideas, concerns, and questions."

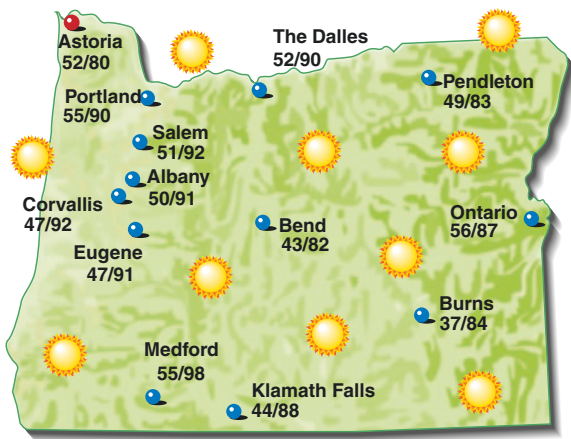

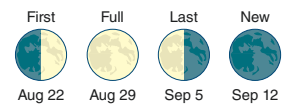

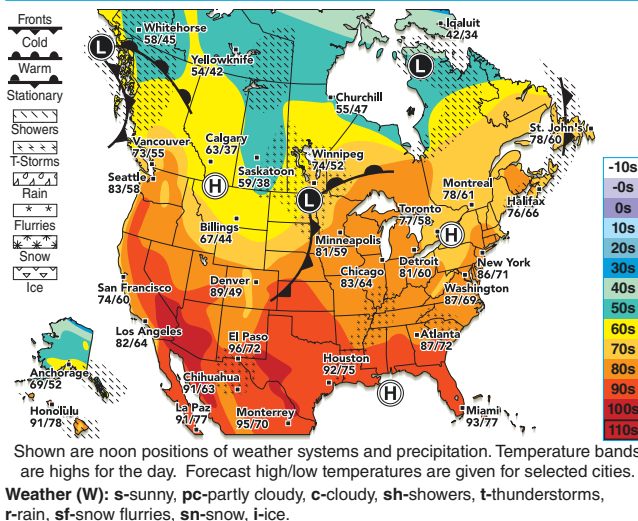
