Shelter seeks volunteers for Cat Room

WARRENTON — The Clatsop County Animal Shelter, 1315 S.E. 19th St., seeks volunteers to help care for and adopt out cats. Volunteers will work either the morning or afternoon shift, one day a week. The morning shift, 9 or 9:30 a.m. until noon, involves cleaning cat cages and providing socialization (playing, petting) to the cats.

Morning volunteers work in pairs. The cleaning takes approximately 1.5 hours for two people. The afternoon shift runs from noon to 4 p.m., and volunteers are expected to be in the Cat Room during those hours to greet the public and help match potential adopters with the right cat. The afternoon shift also provides time for cat socialization.

All new cat volunteers attend an orientation session, which provides general information about the shelter. Training on the Cat Room procedures, both morning cleaning and afternoon adoption, is provided by one of the cat volunteer trainers.
