What do you do in the Coast Guard and how did you end up in that position?

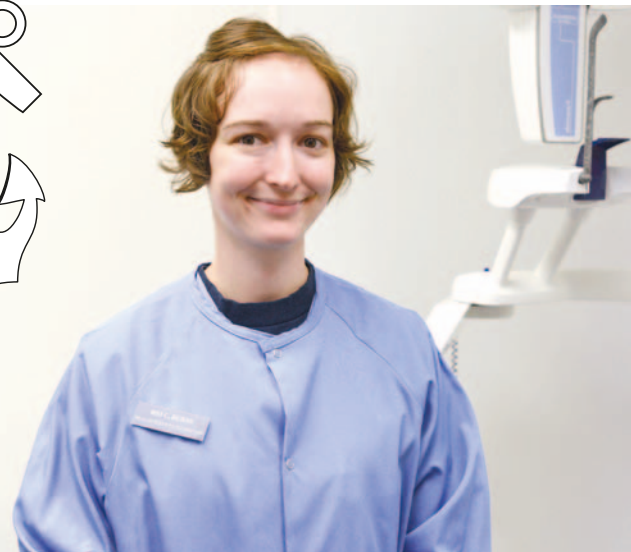
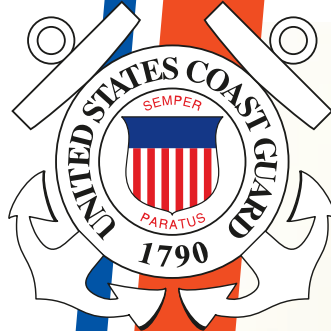
"I am a Pollution Responder with the Incident Management Division. I chose to work in the marine safety field of the Coast Guard because I wanted to help protect and clean up the environment.
