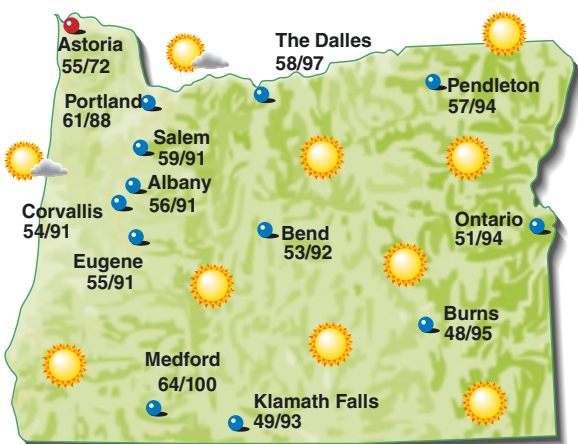

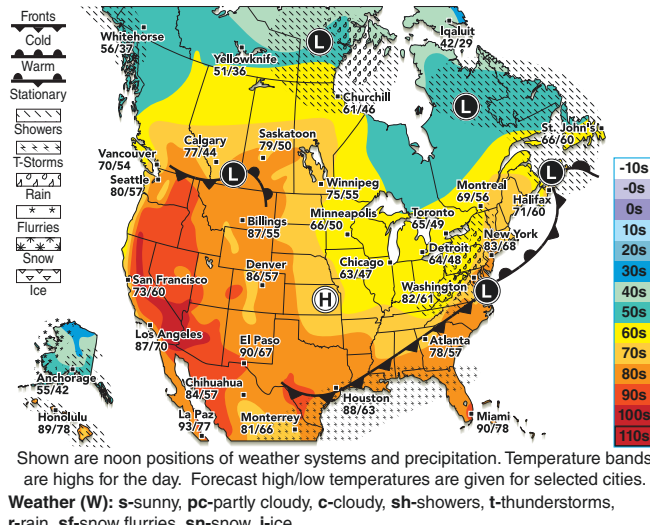

OBITUARY

Donald Louis Matthies

Rosburg, Wash.

Sept. 6, 1923 — Aug. 30, 2015

Donald Louis Matthies died, age 91, on Aug. 30, 2015, in Astoria, after a meaningful life. He was born on Sept. 6, 1923, in Stockton, Calif., to Edna and Emil Matthies, the oldest of three children. He moved with his family to Berkeley as a young child, and graduated from high school there. He joined the Merchant Marines in 1941, where he served as a navigator throughout World War II, shipping military supplies throughout the South Pacific Theater.

After the war, Don split his time between the Merchant Marines and attending UC Berkeley, where he earned a B.S. in chemistry, and a Ph.D. in anatomy, and later, a Ph.D. in reproductive endocrinology. Don's service in the Merchant Marines ended with his focus on post-doctoral work, but he never lost his love of the sea. Among his most cherished keepsakes was a 500-pound anchor he had salvaged from the ocean floor, which he never could find a suitable home for.

In his 39 years of teaching, he was professor at the University of California, UC San Francisco, and the University of North Dakota at Grand Forks. He met Swedish lab technician Marianne von Heijne in San Francisco in 1962, and they were married in 1963. They had two children, Annika, born in 1966, and Karl, in 1969.

Don moved to Astoria in 1996, and to Rosburg, Wash., in 1998. He always had the in-

terest of building a boat, and sailing around the world. His wife, Marianne, divided her time between Rosburg and Sweden, making sure the freezer was well-stocked while she was away.

Don was a strong supporter of peace and justice, and had participated in protests against U.S. Sen. Joseph McCarthy's House Un-American Activities Committee in the 1950s, under which many were accused of and punished for being so-called communists. From 2004, he attended the Peace Gathering in Astoria, and rarely missed a Friday afternoon, navigating there at least 500 times to spend an hour, rain or shine. A favorite sign was, "Torture? In America?" As his health declined, he moved from leaning on a telephone pole, to using a cane, and finally to a walker, which he laboriously toted around in his trusty station wagon.

Don is survived by his wife, Marianne; daughter, Dr. Annika Crosby (Shawn), granddaughter Ceci, grandson Axel, of Minneapolis, and son, Karl (Sonia), of the Bay Area. His brother, Jerome, and sister, Mary, preceded him in death.

A celebration of his life will be held on Saturday, Oct. 17, at 2 p.m., at Rosburg Hall.

Donations in his memory may be made to the American Cancer Society or the South Pacific County Humane Society.
