

# Free emergency response training offered

Clatsop County Emergency Management is offering two upcoming Community Emergency Response Team training sessions for those interested in learning about disaster preparedness.

The 21-hour session is offered in either a nine-week course each Thursday from Sept. 24 to Nov. 12 at the county's emergency operations center in Warrenton, or as a three-day course Nov. 13-15 at Camp Kiwan- along in Warrenton.

The course educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization and disaster medical operations.

Once trained, CERT members can join their local team or simply use the skills learned to improve their personal level of preparedness and assist others in their neighborhood, community or workplace following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help.

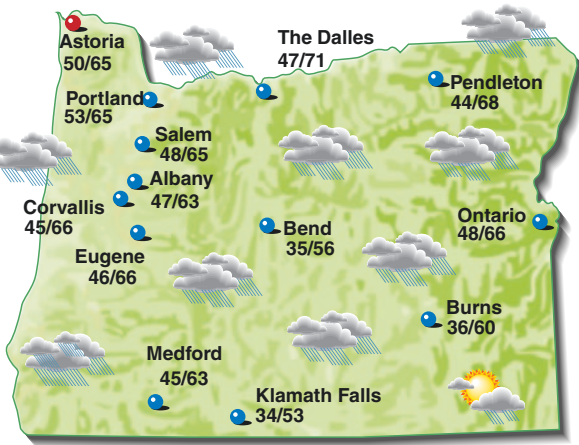

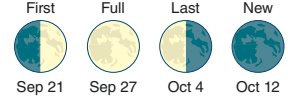

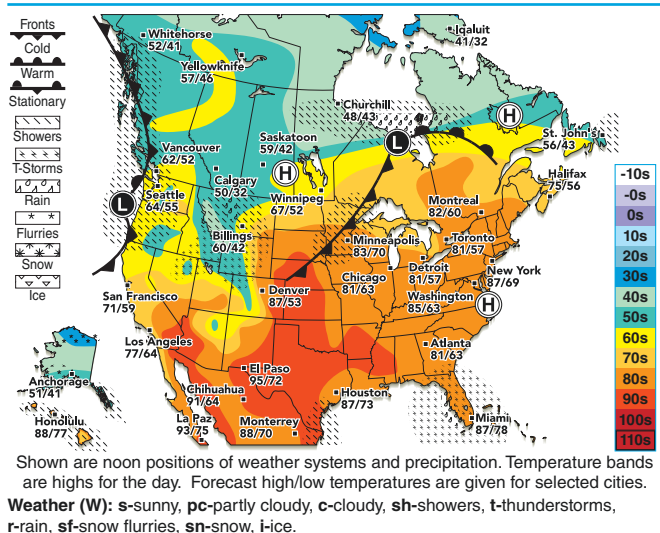
