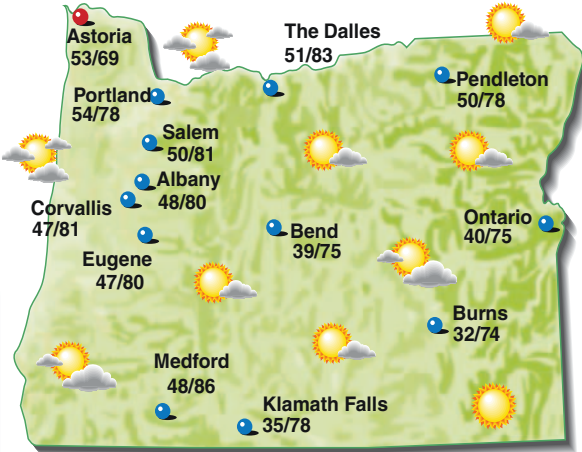

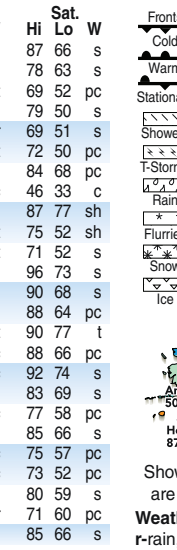

Annual South Slough Scramble nears

Lewis and Clark National Historical Park hosts the sixth annual free South Slough Scramble at 10 a.m. Sept. 26 at Netul Landing. That Saturday is also National Public Lands Day, an annual event to encourage everyone to visit federal lands with free admission to all National Park Service sites.

The Lewis and Clark National Park Association, Prov-

idence Seaside Hospital, and Sunset Empire Parks & Recreation District are teaming up for diabetes awareness for the South Slough Scramble. This Outpace Diabetes hike/run includes a health fair with information about diabetes, nutrition and heart-healthy habits. The start/finish line and the health fair will be at the park's Netul Landing, approximately 1 1/2 miles south of Fort Clatsop.

Runners and hikers can

register for one of two options, a 5K loop and a roughly 10K loop. Both loops take participants along the ups and downs of the South Slough Trail, into the coastal hills, and along the Lewis and Clark River.

Strollers and pets are not allowed, and the event is being held rain or shine. Preregister for free at the Fort Clatsop Visitor Center or online at www.sunsetempire.com, or register the day of the event from 9 to 9:45 a.m.
