

# Warriors win Vernonia Tournament

VERNONIA — The Warrenton volleyball team took a break from league play Saturday, and came home with the first-place trophy after winning the Vernonia Tournament.

The Warriors defeated Harrisburg 25-19, 25-18 in a semifinal, then knocked off Catlin Gabel in the championship match, 25-23, 25-14.

Warrenton played perfect volleyball all day, as the Warriors cruised through pool play without a loss.

The Warriors pounded Neah-Kah-Nie 25-13, 25-14; defeated Clatskanie 25-16, 25-17; and topped Vernonia 26-24, 25-17.

Warrenton plays a non-league match Thursday at South Bend.

# Tax credits: Rules should determine prices

For example, Sky Lakes Medical Center in Klamath Falls was allowed to sell its tax credit for 79 cents on the dollar, instead of 91 cents on the dollar as required under price regulations.

State law calls for the Oregon Department of Energy to adopt rules for energy tax credits that include a formula to determine the prices at which credits could be sold.

"We were in agreement with the Department of Energy that their rule exceeded their statutory authority," Joy Krawczyk, a spokeswoman for the Department of Revenue, wrote in an email. "Statute allows price setting for preliminary certificates, but statute doesn't require a price setting formula for final certificates."

Under that interpretation, the price formula required in state law would not apply to tax credit sales. Its only use would be to provide a theoretical, nonobligatory sale price on the preliminary certificate, which tells applicants the size of the tax credit they will qualify for if they

complete their transit, energy efficiency or alternative fuel projects as promised. The Department of Revenue did not respond to a question about whether former Gov. John Kitzhaber was informed of the interpretation.

According to the Department of Revenue, the agency's legislative coordinator Deanna Mack was the only agency employee involved in discussions with Department of Energy on the issue

in December 2014. However, public records provided by a tax credit broker show the Department of Revenue's corporation tax policy coordinator, Jeff Henderson, was kept in the loop on Buckley's discussions with brokers about tax credit sales as early as October 2014.

Krawczyk said the inclusion of a revenue employee on such a discussion was not unusual.

"Ultimately, we're includ-

ed on a number of emails from Energy because we're responsible for applying the credits claimed on returns and because we inform Energy, upon request, if any portion of a credit has been used when an owner is looking for transfer the credit, as only completely unused credits can be transferred," Krawczyk wrote.

State rules haven't been put in place, Cupples added, and won't be completed until later this week. "None of us know what those rules are until they are put out by the state."

As far as future recreational sales, "the City Council has not taken a formal position at this point in time."

Cupples wrote that "any direction from the council" will be after an opportunity to review the OLCC rules.

Geiger will now file paperwork with the Oregon Health Authority. Then, on Oct. 1, he can open his doors.

"It's been an extremely long process," he said. "It's been very gratifying though. I can't tell you what it's like, man, it's so great to come so far. It's nice to finally, after

these few years, to get some respect, some acceptance and a little bit of gratitude."

## Cannabis Nation also OK
