

Youth sports take center stage

WARRENTON — The LCYSA Osprey dropped a disappointing soccer match Sunday afternoon against the Crossfire Oregon club, which posted a 4-0 win for their first victory of the season.

Crossfire was called for 10 fouls, plus a yellow card, in the physical match. The Osprey had limited chances offensively, with just three shots on goal to Crossfire's 11.

Ricky Godsey, Marco Franco-Houser and co-captain Riley Cameron had standout performances in the loss.

Osprey coach Jerry Boisvert stated, "We certainly could not adjust to the Crossfire's physical play and fast closing speed to every ball. The Crossfire simply out hustled us. They were a team tired of losing and clearly on a mission. They deserved the win."

He added, "Our expectations were too high after a couple easy victories, making this a very frustrating loss. So, it's back to reality, and time to regroup and prepare for a team that is similarly aggressive next Saturday."

The Osprey begin a four-week stretch of both Saturday and Sunday matchups. Competition increases next week with a home match Saturday at 3 p.m. vs. FC Columbia County, a team the Osprey had to rally from a 3-1 half-time deficit to win 5-4 in the Cowlitz Kickoff Classic tournament in July. The Osprey travels to Portland Sunday to face the first place Portland City United SC.

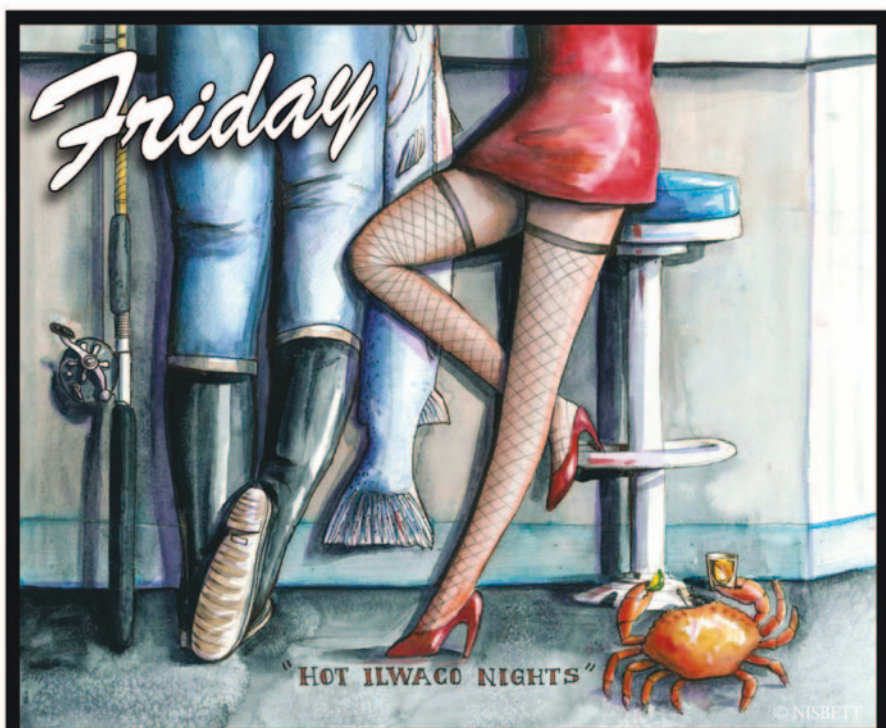
