

# Sheriff's Office arrests ATV thief

The Daily Astorian

An Astoria man riding a stolen all-terrain vehicle from High Life Adventures was arrested Monday after being tracked by law enforcement for multiple days on property from the Clatsop Plains to rural Gearhart.

Clatsop County Sheriff's Office deputies found Tyler Ray Morehouse, 33, sleeping with his feet resting on the footpegs of the stolen ATV

at a campsite in the wooded area between Costco and U.S. Highway 101 Business.

Morehouse was arrested for unrelated warrants and charged with theft by receiving. The ATV was returned to its owner.

The Sheriff's Office is continuing to investigate other burglaries and thefts reportedly related to Morehouse.

A caretaker at Tagg Farm on the Clatsop Plains first reported a person operating an

ATV on the property Friday.

Officers and the caretaker chased the ATV into the woods east of the Clatsop Plains.

A utility trailer and other stolen items were recovered, leading the Sheriff's Office to a burglary on U.S. Highway 101 in the area of Camp Rilea.

On Sunday, the owner of the ATV saw it being operated on SE 19th Street near Costco.

The owner followed and witnessed it traveling down a dirt road off of 19th Street.

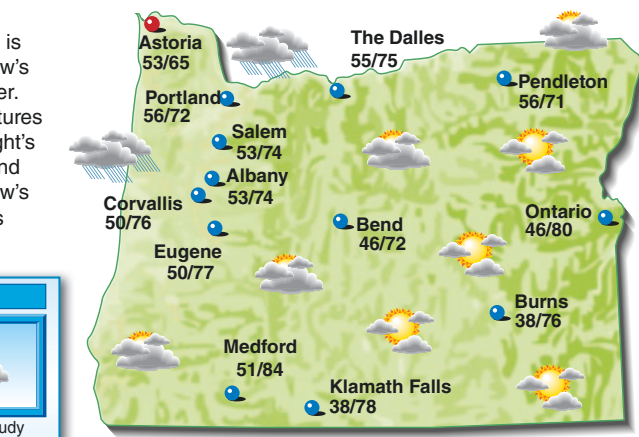

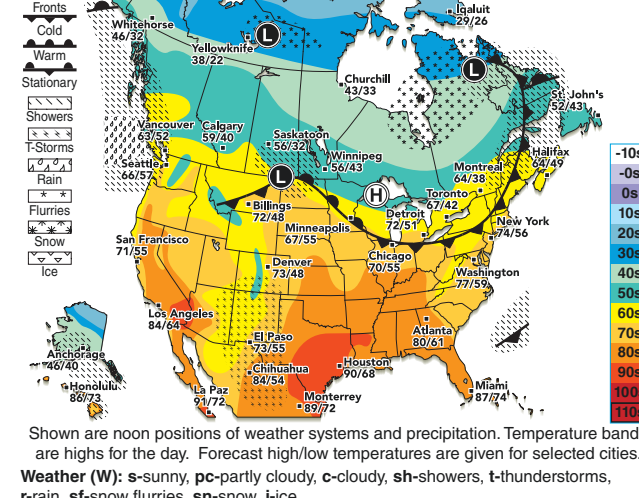

In his early years on Bainbridge Island, Jack enjoyed coaching football and working with kids. He was an avid WSU Cougar fan, and loved to attend his grandchildren's activities, sporting events and graduations. Jack's (almost) full-time hobby was his vegetable garden, which he loved. If he grew too much, he gave the extras away. Jack was lifetime member of the Washington Athletic Club in Seattle.

Jack was preceded in death by his sisters, Jean Whealdon Hornig and Joan Whealdon Ames, and by a granddaughter, Colleen Whealdon-Haught.
