According to Metavivor, an organization focusing on stage 4 metastatic breast cancer, only 2 percent of breast cancer funding goes to help those with metastatic breast cancer, the only form of fatal breast cancer.

The parties include food, activities and blocks to build with.

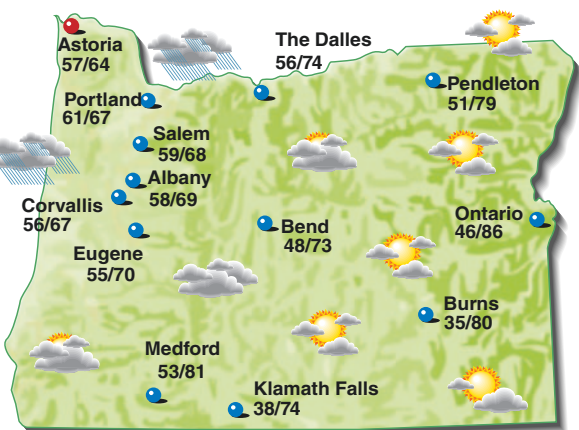

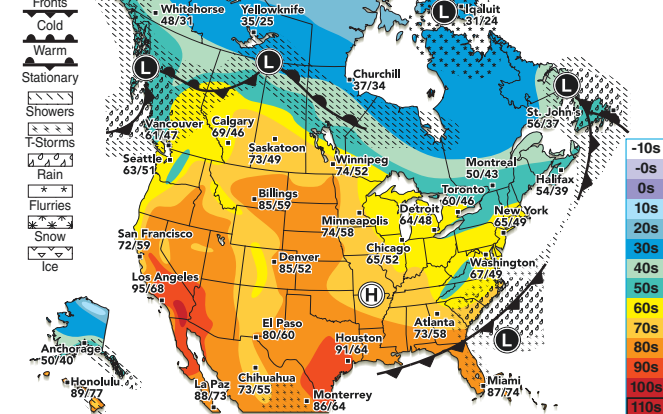
