

Warrenton sweeps Clatskanie

WARRENTON — It's on to the league playoffs for the Warrenton volleyball team, which finished out the regular season with an easy three-game sweep over Clatskanie Monday night, 25-11, 25-23, 25-14.

The Warriors finish fifth in the Lewis & Clark League standings with a 5-6 record, while the Tigers finish 0-11.

Senior Ally Bentley led Warrenton

with nine kills, to go with three ace serves. Landree Mieth added seven kills, and senior Libby Biel finished with four kills, in the last regular season home match for the Warrior seniors.

Astoria competes at Corbett
CORBETT — The Astoria volleyball team closed out the regular season Saturday in the Corbett Tournament, where the Lady Fishermen swept Willamina in pool play, and took one game

from Corbett to finish second in their pool.

In the first round of the championship bracket, Astoria beat Estacada in three games (24-26, 25-7, 15-13), then lost to Cascade Christian in two (19-25, 15-25).

Astoria's RPI ranking improved to No. 25, as the Lady Fishermen (1-9, tied for fifth in the Cowapa League) await word on a spot in the Regional Play-in round.

Recall: Company is offering refunds to customers

"It represents less than one-half of 1 percent of our sales," Andrew Bornstein, the owner of Bornstein Seafood, said. "It's a very small amount."

The last distribution date of the recalled products is September 2015, the FDA said.

"Our canned king salmon, smoked king salmon and garlic pepper smoked king salmon are all OK," Bornstein said in an email. "Further, only our smoked tuna was affected. Our regular canned albacore, low-sodium canned albacore and no-salt canned albacore are also not (affected) by this recall."

Bornstein said the company is offering refunds to customers who purchased the products. They are collecting cans and giving refunds at Warrenton Deep Sea, 45 N.E. Harbor Place. Customers can also call the company's plant at 503-325-6164 to arrange to ship product to them.

Larger recall
Mark Kujala, the owner of Skipanon Brand Seafood and the mayor of Warrenton, said last week the Skipanon recall is a precautionary measure. He said doesn't know the volume of product recalled.

"We are sending reply/response cards to customers to allow them to report illness due to consumption of product," Kujala said in an email Tuesday. "The FDA will also be reviewing these reply/response cards."

Ecola Seafoods Restaurant and Market in Cannon Beach, the Garibaldi Cannery in Garibaldi, Pacific Oyster Company (doing business as The Fish Peddler) of Bay City and other Oregon seafood outlets that privately label and sell Skipanon's cans are also participating in the Skipanon recall.

The recalled products had been distributed to wholesalers and retailers in Oregon, Washington state, Nevada and Michigan and sold over the Internet to customers nation-

wide, Skipanon said. Cindy Beckman, owner of Ecola Seafoods, said when the FDA "realized there was a problem with (Skipanon's) procedure, then (Kujala) contacted us and everybody that he cans for." Ecola Seafoods then contacted the FDA, which advised them to pull the product.

"The recall started with us," Kujala said, "and we decided to issue a nationwide press release about the products. We issued notification letters to our retailers and co-packers. It is the responsibility of those retailers and co-packers to direct their own recall as recommended by the FDA."

He added that there is no timeline on the recall and that Skipanon is in contact with the FDA and the Oregon Department of Agriculture as it works through the recall process.

"Obviously, this has a huge impact on our small family-owned-and-operated business," he said.

Heritage Square: 'Where will the library go on the site?'

design and redevelopment. The trigger for redevelopment is the need for a new public library to replace the aging, 1960s-era library on 10th Street, yet the city has several options for the Heritage Square block, including a housing component

and an amphitheater or other gathering place.

"The biggest key question that we're trying to answer is, 'Where will the library go on the site?'" Cronin said. "And how do we design a library with workforce housing above it?"

Cronin said staff intends to make a final presentation on

Heritage Square to the City Council in November that will include a "go or no-go decision on whether the library will go on that site and, if not, what do we do with the existing library?"

Public enthusiasm for a project is critical, city councilors believe, since redevelop-

ment would likely have to be financed by the city in partnership with private developers.

Tepid public support could leave a mixed-use project vulnerable to politics. The City Council had voted last year to expand the existing public library into the old Waldorf Hotel. But the council, responding

to preservationists who wanted to save the historic Waldorf, switched direction to Heritage Square this year under new Mayor Arline LaMear and new councilors Zetty Nemlowill and Cindy Price.

"Extensive public input is really crucial for this development because it will affect the

library, the Garden of Surging Waves, the American Legion, the Sunday Market and a great deal of precious downtown parking," said Price, whose district includes Heritage Square. "As well as all of the adjacent businesses.

"It's the entire downtown core."

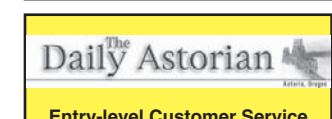
