

Warriors, Rainier go back to the future

WARRENTON — Freshman quarterbacks were battling under the Friday night lights at Warrenton High School, in a key Lewis & Clark League showdown.

Both teams gave a glimpse of the future in the well-played, defensive game.

In the end, Rainier freshman Joey Tripp and the Columbians got the best of Warrenton freshman Gio Martinez and the Warriors, 34-8.

Tripp completed 10-of-15 passes, with two touchdowns, two interceptions and 202 yards in the win, which gives Rainier a 2-0 league record.

Warrenton slips to 0-2 (3-5 overall), with one game left in the three-game league season.

Defensively, the Columbians had five sacks and four interceptions, two by Gunnar Brooks; and Rainier held Warrenton to just 23 yards rushing on 29 carries.

Three big plays by the Columbians made the difference.

On the biggest play, Austin Eversol returned a fumble 70 yards for a touchdown with 1:41 left in the third quarter, giving Rainier a 22-0 lead.

Gavon McFadden caught a 43-yard TD pass from Martinez with two seconds left in the quarter, but the Columbians answered with a pair of scores in the fourth.

Warrenton finishes the regular season Friday at Portland Christian (0-2).

Banks 48, Astoria 14

BANKS — A couple of big plays right before halftime gave the No. 4-ranked Banks Braves all they would need for the win Friday night, as they secured second place in the Cowapa with a 48-14 win over No. 9-ranked Astoria, in the league's Game of the Night.

Tied 14-14 in the second quarter, the Braves scored on a flea-flicker (51 yards, Jake Evans to Hunter Hayes) with 1:06 left; then on the final play of the first half, Banks senior Jaron

Malcom intercepted a Fishermen pass and returned it 46 yards for the score as time ran out for a 28-14 lead.

Banks added three second half touchdowns to pick up the huge victory in the showdown for second place in the Cowapa standings.

The Braves finish 4-1, while the Fishermen conclude the regular season with a 3-2 league record, 5-3 overall.

With their third place finish in the Cowapa, Astoria will host a Regional Play-in game, 6:30 p.m. Friday vs. 21st-ranked South Umpqua, with the winner advancing to the final 16.

After recovering a fumble in the opening minutes, Astoria took a 6-0 lead on a 23-yard run by Carter Wallace.

The Braves answered with a pair of scores to take a 14-6 lead after one quarter, before Wallace capped a 65-yard drive and scored on a 1-yard run early in the second period. Clay Englund caught the two-point conversion from Fridtjof Fremstad to tie the game.

From there, the Braves scored 34 unanswered points, highlighted by a 78-yard punt return by Milo Applebee in the third quarter.

Scappoose 55, Seaside 6

SCAPPOOSE — The Scappoose Indians locked up another Cowapa League title Friday night on their home field, in a 55-6 win over Seaside.

Scappoose was on the scoreboard a mere 18 seconds into the game, as Braden Clark returned the opening kick 90 yards for a touchdown.

Robert Lohman threw the first of his five touchdown passes to Gus Nelson for a 6-yard score, then hit Brennen McNabb for a pair of touchdowns (51 and 20 yards) to close out the first quarter.

Jarrett White caught Lohman's fourth TD pass in the second quarter, and the Indians led 41-6 at halftime. Jaxon Smith scored Seaside's lone touchdown on a 1-yard run in the closing seconds of the first half.

Lohman and Clark hooked up on an 83-yard pass play for a touchdown in the third quarter. Clark finished with 108 yards rushing on just eight attempts, while Lohman finished 8-for-11 passing for 212 yards and five TD's.

Ilwaco 59, Rainier (Wash.) 28

ILWACO, Wash. — Ilwaco jumped out to a 29-0 lead and never looked back Friday, in a 59-28 win over the Rainier (Wash.) Mountaineers in a Pacific 2B League game in Ilwaco.

Jack Odneal completed 12-of-16 passes for 210 yards and six touchdowns, three to Riki Thompson.

Thompson had TD receptions of 32, 23 and 55 yards, and finished with nine catches for 132 yards.

On the ground, Jack Kaino had 21 carries for 137 yards, and teammate Alec Bell rushed for 104 yards on 20 attempts. The

Fishermen had 484 yards in total offense.

Ilwaco improves to 4-3 in league, behind Raymond (7-1), North Beach (6-0) and Life Christian (5-1).

The Fishermen play at South Bend Thursday.

Naselle 66, WSD 12

NASELLE, Wash. — Naselle's march toward a possible state championship continued Thursday with an easy 66-12 over Washington School for the Deaf.

The Comets built a 46-6 halftime lead over the Terriers, as Naselle continues to cruise through its second season of 8-Man football.

Naselle, 6-2 overall and the District 4's top seed, clinches a spot in the final 16 of the Class 1B state tournament.

The Comets finish the regular season Friday against winless Twin Valley.
