

# Osprey score 1-0 win over Southeast Portland SC

The Lower Columbia Osprey returned home from Cleveland High School in Southeast Portland victorious Sunday night, after securing a 1-0 win over the third-place Southeast SC side.

The first half was a tight match, with both sides getting shots on goal. Osprey keeper Tony Tumbarello tallied three saves to match the Osprey's three shots on goal that were saved at the other end.

In the 44th minute, Josh Condit was on frame with a very well struck ball that was saved by a spectacular effort of SESC's keeper, who punched the ball over the bar.

Dalton Byrd sent the ensuing corner kick in to the box, where David Jimenez controlled the ball, only to be fouled.

Jimenez was awarded the penalty kick, and converted what turned out to be the game's only goal.

Shrey Sharma had a number of critical tackles for the Osprey in the second half, winning the ball to end the numerous SESC threats.

SESC had a clear shot

from 16 yards that Osprey keeper Spark Owen dove to his right to block but missed the ball. The ball struck the side post coming out to strike Owen. The ball was then headed back into the goal, but Owen was able to regain footing and dive back for the save.

The final 10 minutes of the match had the Osprey attacking on quick counter plays, resulting in six shots on goal.

Osprey coach Jerry Boisvert said, "This win sure feels good. The kids earned it. Our passing, especially our ability to get the ball out of the defensive end which created many scoring opportunities, was the best of the season; we certainly keep improving. I wish we could have put a second goal in the net to help relieve the tension-packed second half. I'm glad it was them chasing the score and not us. Credit goes to the team's defensive efforts in holding on to the shutout."

The Osprey conclude the season this weekend, hosting BSC-Newberg at 2 p.m. Saturday, and a rematch with Southeast SC, 2 p.m. Sunday.
