

See sculpture paintings in new art show

Terrie Remington displays recent work at Grace Episcopal

ASTORIA — Terrie Remington will open a new art show of recent work that reflects her unique style of sculptured painting at Grace Episcopal Church.

The show runs Friday, Nov. 6 to Dec. 10. The opening artist reception will take place at 11 a.m. Sunday, Nov. 8. Grace Episcopal gallery is located at 1545 Franklin Ave. Viewings are also possible by contacting the artist at 503-325-9580.

"It is my quest to capture the true essence of a subject. I need to get to the passion of it — the emo-

tional fire — the driving force," says Remington, an Astoria artist and resident, about her process. "I choose to work with sculpture combined with color. The tactile quality of sculpture provides information of depth and energy. The colors speak in a more ethereal realm. I use whatever media necessary to manifest that elusive quality that connects the emotional and spiritual to the physical art form."

The sculpture painting technique was developed by Remington during her 11 years of

residency in Spain and was first introduced in 1967 at her gallery "Refugi d'Art" in Barcelona, Spain. Paintings are sculpted on canvas-covered board. Multi-media sculpture is of clay, natural fibers and raw linen, marbled for durability, then painted in acrylics and oils. Remington's art style can be viewed at www.terrieremington.com

Remington was born in Rockville Centre, New York. She has studied art in Phoenix, Arizona, at the University of Ari-

Long-time supporter and board member Chuck Meyer created this annual event as a way to help stabilize finances for ASOC to continue its theatrical programs for all ages in the community.

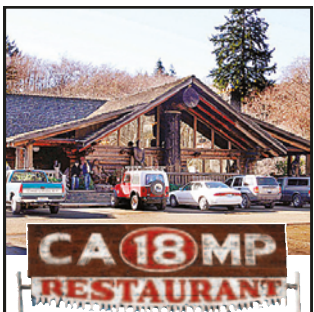
