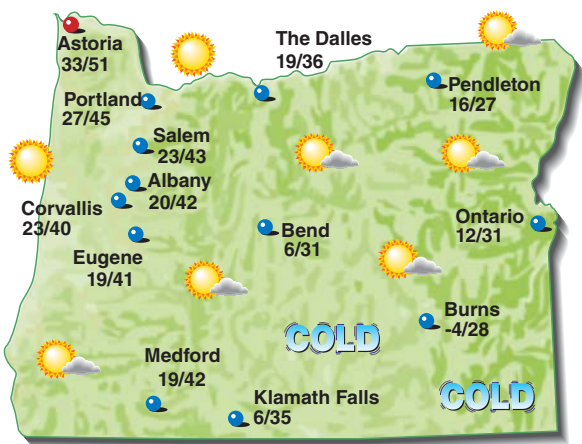

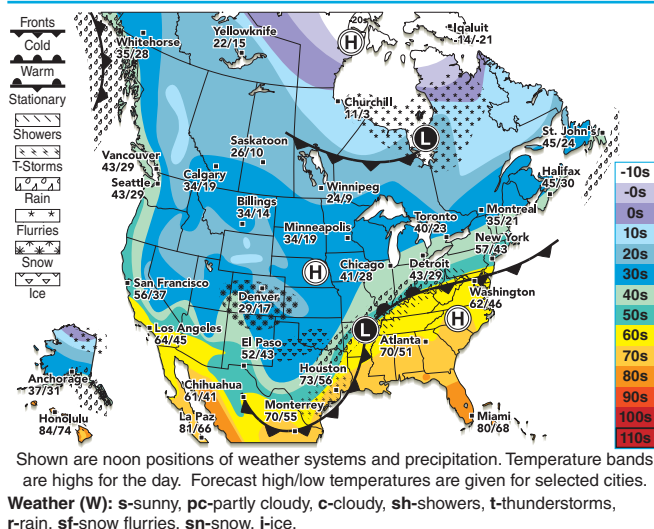

Grants awarded to help special education, at-risk students

The Northwest Regional Education Service District awarded \$19,152 in grants for special education and at-risk student programs. More than \$7,500 of that went to programs in Clatsop County:

- Cindy Sapp, an educator at Astoria Middle School, received \$398 for wiggle seats and exercise balls to use as alternative seating in the school's special education resource room.
- Whitney Randall in the special programs office of Astoria School District received \$1,875 to purchase an established vending machine route to provide students in the county's high-needs con-

sortium classroom a way to develop vocational and applied academic skills.

- Stacie Peeler, who works with autistic students in the Northwest Regional Education Service District, received \$1,800 to build skills for families in the county with autistic children up to 21 years old.
- Meredit McGrath, with Seaside School District's early childhood special education program, received \$200 to refurbish an abandoned garden bed to teach children about nutrition, colors, counting and qualitative and quantitative concepts.
- Jackie Bergerson, who also works with autistic students, received \$1,000 to establish a sensory equipment

library to help teachers and parents in the county check out trial materials for students who struggle with sensory differences.

- Angie Harrington, with the regional early learning council, received \$1,800 to provide early literacy education for parents and caregivers throughout the county.
- Paulette Rubio, a regional speech language therapist, received \$225 to provide enrichment opportunities for speech-language students in the Warrenton-Hammond School District through National Geographic science exploration curriculum.
- Kathleen Adams from Warrenton High School received \$300 to enhance her modified foods class.

Driver flees after striking pedestrian

A woman in a wheelchair sustained minor injuries after being struck by a vehicle Wednesday afternoon while crossing in the crosswalk at 33rd Street and Lief Erikson Drive in Astoria, according to police.
