

Sign up for mushroom foraging day at North Fork 53

NEHALEM — Local agritourism food hub North Fork 53 will host a Mushroom Foray and Dinner on Saturday, Dec. 12. Sign up for a day of early winter fungi and truffle foraging with mushroom experts Matt Trappe and Jordan Weiss. The event will take place from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. and start at North Fork 53, located at 77282 Oregon Highway 53. Trappe will lead participants into the North Oregon Coast

woods for a hike, and he will talk about the various ecological niches of all the fungi foraged. Weiss will assist with identifying the fungi. There will be plenty of time for questions and answers. After hiking, participants will return to Northfork 53 for mushroom presentations by Trappe and Weiss and to examine spores under microscopes. Then, sit down to a fungi feast created by recent “Chopped”

winner farm-to-table chef Stacey Givens of Side Yard Farm in Portland. Givens will prepare a four-course meal paired with wine and beer highlighting the mushrooms collected and local organic farm foods. Trappe is a forest ecologist specializing in mycology, disturbance ecology, nutrient cycling and soil microbiology. This event is limited to 20 paid attendees with two work-

trade slots available; early registration is encouraged. Cost is \$150 per person, including an all-day mushroom immersion course with packed organic lunch and paired dinner.
