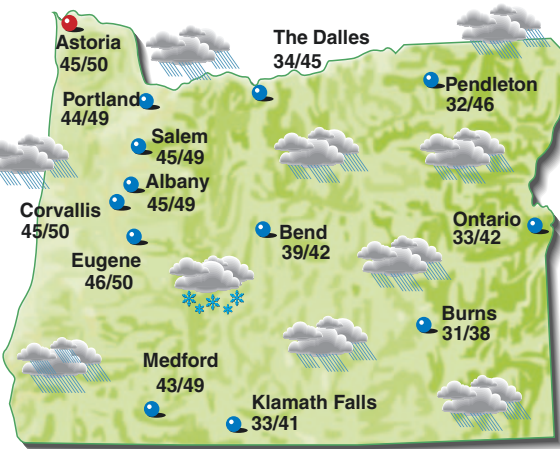

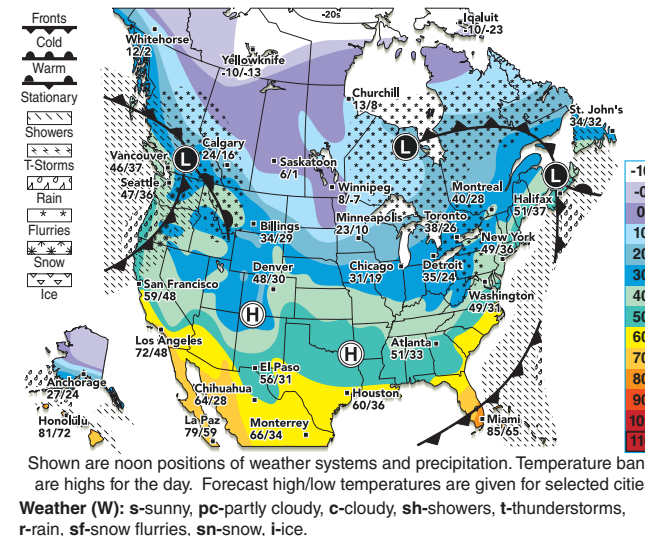

### Robert Alexander 'Piky Bob' Williams

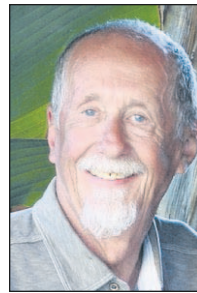
