

Goozee 'Outstanding' at Wahkiakum meet

CATHLAMET, Wash. — The Knappa and Astoria wrestling teams finished eighth and ninth, respectively, in the team standings of the Wahkiakum Down River Challenge meet Saturday.

Kelso won the team title with 214.5 points, while Knappa finished with 73 points, ahead of Astoria, 72.

Knappa's Andrew Goozee won the meet's "Outstanding Wrestler Award" for the upper weights division, as he took first place at 182 pounds.

Teammates Luke Goozee (113) and Reuben Cruz (154) both took third in their divisions, and Dawson Whiteside was fourth at 145.

Astoria's Sariah Dieffenbach finished second in her weight class, falling short in the title match to Billy Bergenson of Napavine.

Astoria senior Bronson Holthusen took third at 220 pounds, posting a decision over White Salmon's Paul Demchuk.

Fisherman teammate Andrew Poplin pinned Mirosau Roubal of Clatskanie to place fifth at 285.
