

Holiday tournaments in full swing

The Astoria boys basketball team capped Day 1 of the 47th annual Vince Dulcich Memorial Tournament, with a 69-48 win over Rainier late Monday night.

Astoria's win highlighted a day filled with basketball tournaments across the state, with local teams taking part in several different holiday tournaments.

The Fishermen trailed the Class 3A Columbians 15-14 in the second quarter, before they began to wear down Rainier in the second half to pull away for the victory in front of a large crowd at the Brick House.

Astoria advances to the tournament semifinals, where the Fishermen will face Sutherlin at 9 tonight.

After being held scoreless in the first quarter, Astoria's Derek Jarrett hit a pair of 3-pointers in the second period, and scored 10 of his game-high 16 points in the quarter to help the Fishermen build a 34-21 halftime lead.

Fridtjof Fremstad finished with 14 points, while Morgan Fruith had 13 and Kyle Strange added 11 for Astoria.

Sutherlin 60, Knappa 38

Knappa was matched against Class 4A Sutherlin in the first round of the Dulcich, and the bigger Bulldog team led from start to finish in a 60-38 win over the Loggers.

Sutherlin held a narrow 11-5 lead after one quarter, but then poured it on over the second and third periods, outscoring the Loggers 41-14 to

take a commanding lead that reached 56-21.

Sutherlin had three players in double figures, led by Wryland McKnight's 19.

Dale Takalo had 17 points and Colton Weirup added 11 for the Loggers, who drop into the consolation bracket to face Rainier today (2:30 p.m.).

Astoria won a lopsided contest over Knappa, 59-4, in a first-round girls matchup of the Dulcich Tournament Monday night.

The Lady Loggers finished 1-for-26 from the field, and the Fishermen were 27-for-72 on field goal attempts, and 5-for-21 at the free throw line.

Defensively, Astoria forced 45 turnovers and held Knappa scoreless in the second and fourth quarters.

Kaitlyn Landwehr scored all four points for the Loggers. Her layup early in the game had Knappa within 4-2, but Astoria scored the next 35 points for an eventual 39-2 lead in the third quarter.

Taylor Mickle led Astoria with 11 points, while team-

mates Chloe Hunt and Sam Hemsley added 10 apiece.

Astoria advances to the semifinals, where the Lady Fish will play R.A. Long at 7:30 tonight.
