Magnanimous Mug awards \$4,200 to Assistance League of the Columbia Pacific

The Fort George Magnanimous Mug Awards were held Nov. 29 at the brewery. A call went out at the start of November for nominations of craft beer lovers who were also doing great things in the community. Six finalists were ultimately chosen, and each nominee picked a nonprofit organization.

The nominees were as follows: Dulcye Taylor, Astoria Warming Center; David Reid, Clatsop Animal Assistance; Norma Hernandez, North Coast Food Web; Jes-

sica Schleif, Clatsop County Animal Shelter; Dan Bartlett, Astoria Downtown Historic District Association; and Jeff Daly, Assistance League of the Columbia Pacific.

Each nominee set out with the goal to raise as much money as possible to earn the Magnanimous Mug for 2016. The person raising the most would get a matching donation from Fort George Brewery. Jeff Daly raised over \$2,100, and with the Fort George matching donation, Assistance League of

the Columbia Pacific (ALCP) received \$4,200.

"Assistance League of the Columbia Pacific sincerely thanks Jeff Daly and Fort George Brewery for their support," Deanna Patterson said.
