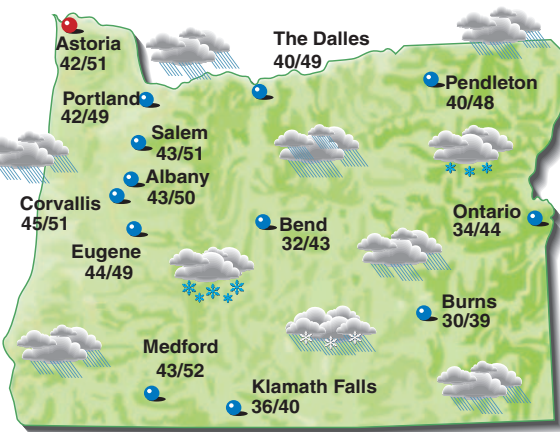

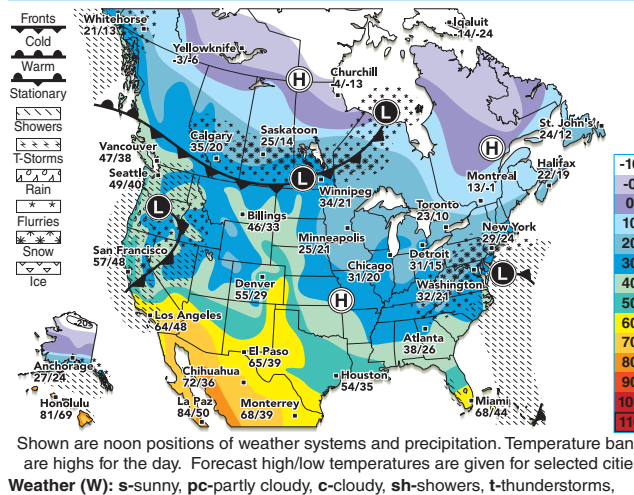

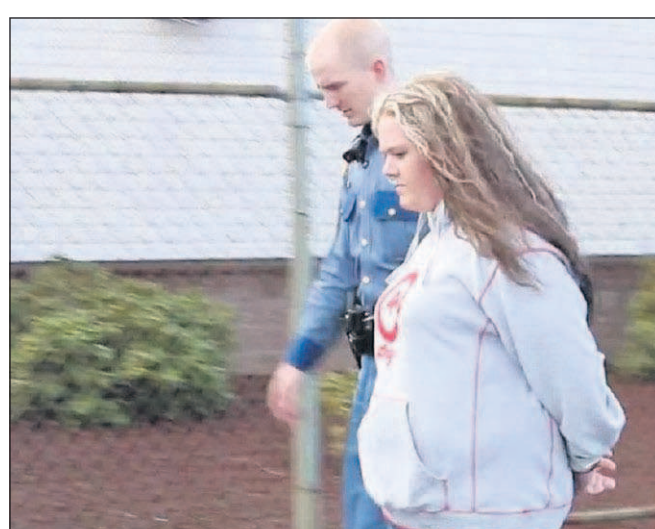

Former peninsula resident arrested in inmate-sex case

CHEHALIS, Wash. — A former peninsula resident was arrested last week on suspicion of having sexual relations with an inmate at the juvenile detention facility where she worked.

The Washington State Patrol arrested Erin Lee Snodgrass, 36, at Green Hill School in Chehalis. She is charged with first-degree custodial sexual misconduct.

In Washington state, it is a felony for any law enforcement officer, corrections officer or other employee of a correctional facility to have sexual intercourse with a person who is under arrest, or in custody, even if the sex was consensual.

Snodgrass had worked as a counselor at Green Hill since 2013, according to Chris Wright, a spokesperson for the Department of Social and Health Services. The department's Juvenile Rehabilitation Administration manages Green Hill, a medium and maximum security facility that serves older teen boys and young men.

According to a press release, the department ordered an investigation last year after staff members at Green Hill reported suspicions that Snodgrass was engaged in allegedly inappropriate behavior. The

Washington State Patrol conducted the investigation. Juvenile corrections officials placed Snodgrass on an alternative assignment, where she did not have any contact with juveniles during the course of the investigation, the press release said.

Wright said Tuesday that the alleged victim is now 19 years old. He did not know when the alleged misconduct occurred, or how old the alleged victim was at the time.

"We are disturbed by the actions of this individual and have done everything we can to hold her fully accountable," Rehabilitation Administration Assistant Secretary John Clayton said in the press release. "DSHS has

zero tolerance for this type of behavior." Clayton said the department has conducted additional training with staff and detention and rehabilitation facility residents about how to recognize inappropriate misconduct, and how to report it.

Snodgrass, formerly Erin Stiebritz, is originally from Montana, but she lived in Long Beach and graduated with the Ilwaco High School class of 1997. According to a June 1997 *Chinook Observer* grad profile, she was an honors student, athlete and cheerleader who participated in extracurricular math, science and drama activities, as well as National Honor Society and Running Start.

Power restored after storm outage

High winds knocked out power to about 15,000 customers between Warrenton and Nehalem Thursday morning for a period of about 15 minutes.

Between 9:20 and 9:37

a.m., 15,000 customers from Warrenton, Seaside and Cannon Beach lost power for varying lengths of time due to high winds during Thursday's rains, according to Pacific Power spokesman Tom Gauntt.

The storm interfered with electricity transmission lines

outside of Astoria, he said, interrupting power throughout the South County.

Most outages were restored within three to five minutes.

"The system is designed to shut down to protect itself," Gauntt said.
