

'Smart Driver' class starts Monday

AARP is holding a "Smart Driver" class from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday at Columbia Memorial Hospital, Columbia Center, Chinook Room, 2021 Marine Drive. Register through Clatsop Community College at 503-338-2408. The class includes a 45-minute break for lunch, and two short breaks. Those attending should come early to get the paperwork done. Seating is limited. Upcoming classes are:

March 16 at Bob Chisolm Community Center in Seaside; March 16 at Humps Restaurant in Clatskanie; and April 14 at the Astoria Senior Center. These courses are designed for seniors age 50 and older, but anyone can attend. Oregon state law provides for a discount on auto insurance premiums for completing this course. Attendance at the entire class is required to receive a certificate of completion.

Most insurance companies require that a refresher course be taken every three years to continue to receive the discount; or every two years for those who are 70 or older. The cost for the class is \$15 for AARP members and \$20 for nonmembers. Tuition is payable at the start of class, with checks made payable to AARP. Oregon Cultural Trust visits area to talk grants

A 12-stop tour by the Oregon Cultural Trust and the group's partners starts in Astoria Tuesday, encouraging local cultural nonprofits to apply for nearly \$5 million in collective grant funds. The trust's Manager Aili Schreiner and representatives from the Oregon Arts Commission, Oregon Heritage, Oregon Humanities and the Oregon State Historic Preservation Office, along with the Oregon Community Foundation and Portland's Regional Arts and Culture

Council, will be in Columbia Hall on Clatsop Community College's main campus (1651 Lexington Ave.) from 4 to 6 p.m. Tuesday. The trust encouraged libraries, arts organizations, museums, cultural centers, historical societies, arts alliances, literary groups and heritage organizations to attend. "There are more than 1,450 cultural nonprofits serving Oregonians," Schreiner said in a release. "We want to make sure they know about the grant funds that are here to support them."

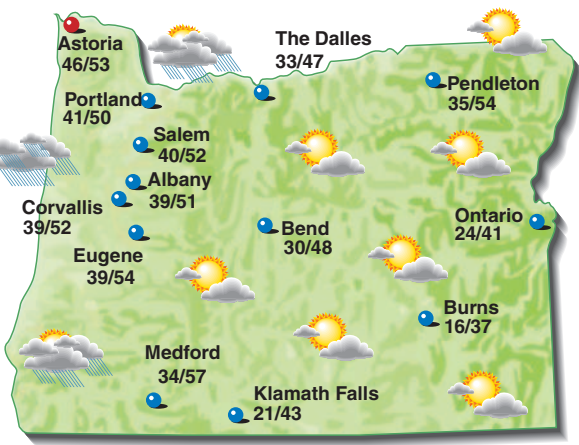

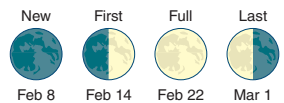

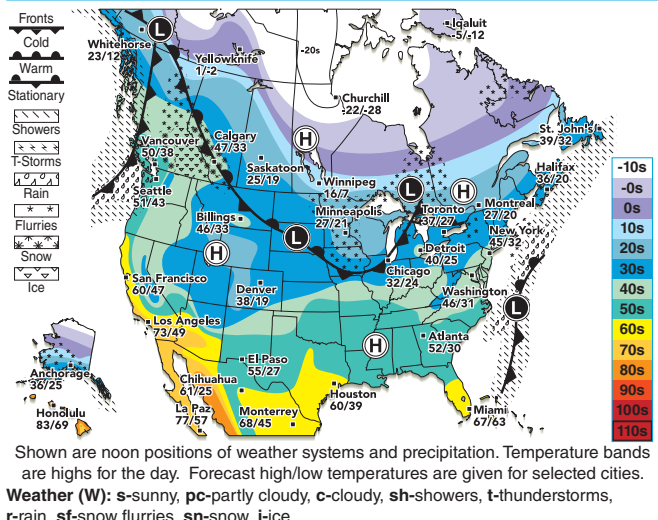
