Stuff the Truck event sets new record

Once again the results of the annual Stuff the Truck Food Drive have set a new record. Each year, since 2008, Arbor Care Tree Specialists, led by Luke Colvin, organizes sponsorships, posters, volunteers and media; all geared to collect food and funds to support the fight against hunger in Clatsop County.

To date, after eight years of the event, the Clatsop Community Action (CCA) Regional Food Bank has collected 41,605 pounds of food at the doors of local supermarkets like the North Coast Fred Meyer, donated directly by people in local communities, and over \$72,100 from customer donations and sponsorships of the events.

The food bank procurement system, operated by the CCA Regional Food Bank, has accessed over 402,106 pounds of food with the donated funds from the Stuff the Truck event, which is distributed to emergency food outlets

throughout Clatsop County.

Each year the CCA Regional Food Bank provides enough emergency food for nearly 1.5 million meals for low income individuals and families in Clatsop County. "Hunger has proven it does not discriminate;
