

# Justice Scalia died of 'natural causes' at age 79

WASHINGTON — U.S. Supreme Court Justice Antonin Scalia died of natural causes and no autopsy was necessary, a judge has told The Associated Press.

Presidio County Judge Cinderela Guevara told The Associated Press on Sunday she consulted with Scalia's personal physician and sheriff's investigators, who said there were no signs of foul play, before concluding that he had died of natural causes. He was found dead

in his room at a West Texas resort ranch Saturday morning. Guevara says the declaration was made around 1:52 p.m. Saturday.

Chris Lujan, a manager for Sunset Funeral Homes in Texas, said the 79-year-old jurist's body was taken from the El Paso facility late Sunday afternoon and was to be flown to Virginia, although he had no details. Scalia's family didn't think a private autopsy was necessary and requested that his remains be returned to Washington as soon as possible, Lujan said.

Scalia's weekend death was as much of a shock to those at

the ranch as it was to the rest of the nation.

The owner of Cibolo Creek Ranch near Marfa, where Scalia died, said the justice seemed his usual self at dinner the night before he was found "in complete repose" in his room.

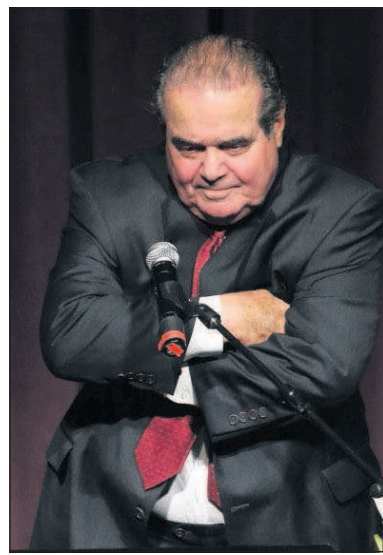
John Poindexter told reporters Scalia was part of a group of about 35 weekend guests. He arrived Friday around noon.

The group had dinner Friday night and Scalia was his "usual, personable self," Poindexter said. Scalia retired around 9 p.m., saying he wanted a long night's sleep, according to Poindexter.

A procession that included about 20 law enforcement officers arrived in the early hours Sunday at the funeral home more than three hours from the ranch, Lujan said.

Kristina Mills, a history teacher at nearby Chapin High School, came to the funeral home to pay her respects and brought flowers.

"Recognizing his contribution to serving our country just compelled me to come," she said. "I wanted to do yellow roses because for him dying in Texas. I didn't want his family to have bad memories of Texas."

From the group's website, "The Oregon Crusaders holds a deep-seated philosophy of Education Through Performance. Our purpose is to provide world class education through performance in the areas of percussion, brass, dance and visual ensemble artistry."

More simply put, Tila says "Oregon Crusaders is a drum and bugle corps in the world class, and we perform throughout the second half of the summer."

"In June, we'll have one concert," he said. "It's just a stand-

still, and we'll be playing our show."

The Crusaders have a "Preview Gala" June 26, followed by a free concert and tour send-off June 29, both in Portland.

"Every other performance that you'll see will be us performing our show on the field," Tila said.

And every time the Crusaders perform, "we're also competing," he said. "There's other world-class groups — for example, the Spirit of Atlanta, the (Seattle) Cascades ... almost every state has their own drum corps at this point."

And the Crusaders are Ore-

gon's official drum and bugle corps.

The average age in the horn line is "around 15 to 21," said the 16-year-old Tila, who plays the mellophone, a brass instrument used in marching similar to the orchestral French horn.

Members have to audition to make the Crusaders, and they must re-audition every "offseason" to remain with the group.

"You'll go there with the audition music that's been provided on the website, go into a room and play it, and at the end of the camp they'll give you your score," Tila says, "and if you made it, a contract."

From there, "everyone has to audition every year that they want to be a part of the organization."

There are groups, Tila says, such as the Blue Devils International (out of Concord, California) which travel outside the country.

The Crusaders keep it local, mostly.

Tila plays several other instruments besides the mellophone, including the euphonium in the Astoria marching band, and the French horn in the school concert band.

"With our school program, everyone is required to get into

music for at least one year in the sixth grade. I thought it was really cool, so I stuck with it."

Again, from the Crusaders' website: "OC employs some of the most talented design and instructional professionals in the country, who design programs that over 250 talented performers convey through a powerful, athletic and artistic performance. Oregon Crusaders produce three ensembles, including the Oregon Crusaders Drum and Bugle Corps, OC Indoor winter percussion ensemble, and OC Independent winter colorguard."

Tila said, "The first couple performances we do in June will

be in Oregon, and once we're done with those, we'll be going all the way to Indianapolis."

Other Pacific Northwest dates for the Crusaders include an exhibition show in Medford June 30; a show in Renton, Wash., July 1; a "Home show" July 2 in Tigard; and the group will perform in a parade and exhibition show on the Fourth of July in Seaside.

Tila has not decided if he wants to come back for a third year with the Crusaders, but regardless, there will always be music.

# Injuries: Incidence of nonfatal injuries has not been previously studied

Understanding the type and nature of fatalities and injuries, including describing and categorizing the types of injuries, is the first step in identifying safety issues and pinpointing areas for prevention, she said.

Kincl and a team of researchers examined 12 years of death and injury data, and found that 28 people died while commercially fishing for Dungeness crab from 2002-2014. In that same period, just 45 injuries were reported to the U.S. Coast Guard.

The fatality rate among Dungeness crab fishermen is several times higher than the national rate for commercial fishing. But the injury rate among Dungeness fishermen is much lower than injury rates in other commercial fishing fleets that have been studied.

"Fatal injuries are tracked in a national system, but non-fatal injuries are not," Kincl said. "We knew there was likely underreporting, but we had no idea how low the injury numbers were until now."

## Understanding injuries

The findings, published in the latest issue of the journal International Maritime Health, are the first step to better understanding fishing injuries among Dungeness crab fishermen. The research is part of an OSU-led research project to identify and reduce the risks of injuries in the industry, Kincl said.

The Fishermen Led Injury Prevention Program, or FLIPP, is designed to take a new approach to fishing industry injury prevention by working with commercial Dungeness crab fishermen to identify and reduce injury risks. The

### BY THE NUMBERS

- There were 28 fatal and 45 nonfatal injuries reported between 2002 and 2014 in the Dungeness crab fleet.
- 20 of the fatalities resulted from capsizing or sinking.
- Ten of the 13 capsizings and sinkings were caused by bad weather.
- Many nonfatal injuries occurred ondeck when fishermen were working with gear, particularly when hauling the gear (47 percent).
- The most frequently reported injuries affected the upper extremities (48 percent), and fractures were the most commonly reported injury type (40 percent).
- None of the fishermen who died during a vessel disaster were able to don immersion suits or enter a life raft.
- Eight crabbers died from drowning after falling overboard. None of these victims was wearing a personal flotation device when they drowned.
- The majority of injured crewmembers were deckhands (88 percent).

project is supported by a three-year, \$825,000 grant from the National Institutes for Occupational Safety and Health. Kincl is the principal investigator.

The lead author of the paper, Samantha Case, is a researcher in the NIOSH office in Alaska.

Other co-authors are OSU Associate Professor Viktor Bovbjerg; OSU doctoral student Laura Syron and Devin Lucas, who earned his doctorate at OSU and works at NIOSH.

The researchers found that the majority of the fatalities, about 71

percent, occurred during vessel disasters, such as boats capsizing or sinking. The other deaths were the result of a fisherman drowning or falling overboard. Fractures were the most commonly reported injury, at 40 percent, followed by hypothermia, lacerations and digit amputations.

"In general, underreporting of occupational injuries from employers has been linked to concerns of financial and regulatory repercussions, and the burden of reporting itself may be a barrier," according to the researchers.

## Meetings with crabbers

Working with Oregon Sea Grant and community researchers in local fishing communities, Kincl and her colleagues are meeting with focus groups of fishermen and surveying fishing crews along the Pacific coast to learn more about safety and injuries in the industry.

"No one has ever gone up and down the coast and learned from the fishermen," Kincl said. "What are they doing to stay safe? Are there things that can be improved? How can we share that information among the various crews?"

By the end of the project, researchers plan to come up with and test several interventions that could help reduce injuries among crab fishermen.

"We want to identify some things that might work, but we don't want to tell them what to do," Kincl said. "We want to let them decide what would be most helpful."
