Eventually, he and Florence decided to relocate to a warmer climate and chose Prescott, Arizona, where they explored the state they came to love so much. Rock hunting and polishing became a full-time hobby. Their dream was to convince all their children to move south.

Herb was preceded in death by his parents and two siblings, John Darnell and Blanche Kenzler. He lost his beloved wife, Florence, in 1992.

He leaves behind his children, Pat Raugust (David), Lezlie Westley McDonald (Paul), Dale Darnell (Susan), DeWayne Darnell (Laurene), and Dean Darnell (Marissa); two sisters, Alyce Wooldridge (Henry) and Joyce VanHereweghe (Louis); a brother, Dale Darnell (Sheryl); and numerous grandchildren, great-grandchildren, nieces and nephews.

Boice R. Moore passed away Feb. 1, 2016, at the Hopewell Hospice House in Portland, surrounded by his family. He was 79 years old.

Born Feb. 7, 1936, in Astoria, Oregon, he was the son of Boice Moore and Maxine (Caspell) Moore McKillip, and stepson of Ray McKillip. He was primarily raised in Wauna, Oregon.

Most of his school years he attended school in Westport, Oregon. During his school days he was involved in Boy Scouts, baseball, basketball, football, student government, the school newspaper, and was chosen to go to Boys State. He graduated in 1954 from Clatskanie High School.

He went to Oregon Technical Institute and graduated with a degree in appliance technology in 1957. In 1958, he joined the Army, where he was a Nike Ajax Missile tech instructor.

In the early years Boice worked at a boarding house in Wauna, as an apprentice for a logging company in Klamath Falls, at Bjorklands in Seaside, and at Dynamic TV & Radio, also in Seaside, of which he later became the owner, and changed the name to Dynamic TV & Appliance. After closing Dynamic TV, he went to work at Hunt's Home Furnishings in Astoria, and then finished his career with another ownership, Moore's Appliance Service. He retired in 2012.

Boice had a love of people and conversation. He loved fishing and crabbing with his friends. He was an excellent woodworker and gardener, a typical old school "Mr. Fix It." He loved exploring and finding new places to visit and meet people. He loved spending time with his family and

friends, although a perfect morning for him was a cup of coffee, a newspaper and the great outdoors.

He was active with the Seaside Volunteer Fire Department and retired as assistant chief after 40 years of service. He also was a member of the Seaside Elks Lodge, the Cannon Beach American Legion and Our Saviour's Lutheran Church.

Boice is survived by his wife, Wanda, who was the love of his life and his best friend. They were married for 39 years. He is also survived by his children: son, Michael Moore of Keenesburg, Colorado; daughter, Laurie McKenna and her husband, Scott, of Frederick, Colorado; son, Robert Moore and his wife, JoAnne, of San Leandro, California; son, James Sorrels Jr. of Monmouth, Oregon; and daughter, Patricia Sommers and her husband, David, of Bend, Oregon. He is also survived by his cousins, Tom Caspell and Bob Caspell; and grandchildren, Lacey Turner, Dustin Scammel, Megan Ouellette, James Sorrels III, Patrick Sommers and Robert McKenna. He was preceded in death by his mother, father, stepfather and his brother.

A celebration of life will be held Sunday, Feb. 28, at 2 p.m. at Our Saviour's Lutheran Church, 320 First Ave., in Seaside. There will be a continuation of the celebration of Boice's life and reception following the service at the Seaside Fire Hall, 150 S. Lincoln St., also in Seaside.

**Astoria family displaced after kitchen fire**

An Astoria family has been displaced after their apartment at 10 Halsey Road caught fire Monday evening from a stove left unattended.

The family — three adults, two children and two pets — is being assisted by the Red Cross. No one was injured in the fire.

Astoria Fire Chief Ted Ames said crews responded at about 6:30 p.m.

At the scene, firefighters saw light smoke coming from an open door of the apartment,

which is on the ground floor of a two-story fourplex unit.

One of the occupants had almost controlled the fire with a portable fire extinguisher. Once the fire department responded, the crew was able to fully contain the fire.

"There was quite a bit of smoke and heat damage and fire damage in the kitchen area," Ames said. "The family could not stay in the apartment."

Ames estimates the damage to the apartment at about \$30,000, and the damage to the contents of the apartment at about \$20,000.

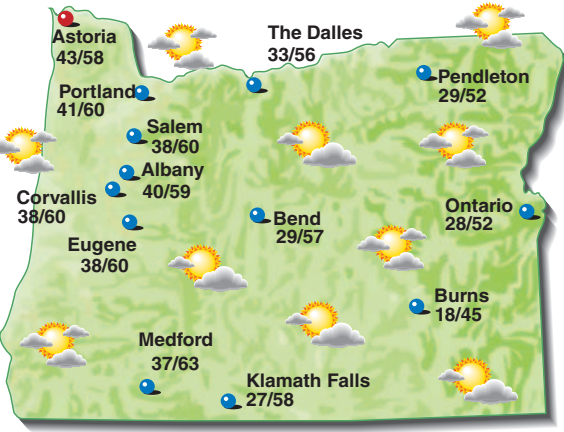

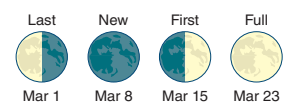

Tonight's Sky: Orion and friends are visible above the southern horizon after sunset.

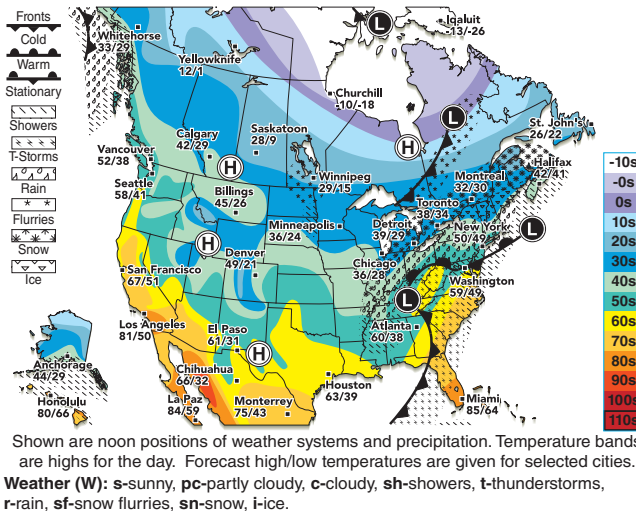
