

# Port Commission expands Bornstein lease for storage

The Port of Astoria Commission approved a new five-year lease Tuesday to expand Bornstein Seafoods' space by more than 9,600 square feet in the Pier 2 fish processing warehouse, but only if the company uses it for storage.

At the beginning of Tuesday's Port Commission meeting, Commissioner Stephen Fulton asked that commissioners adjourn to an impromptu closed executive session to discuss Bornstein Seafoods' lease before coming back out

to vote publicly. Andrew Bornstein, co-owner of Bornstein Seafoods, was in attendance, but left before the executive session.

Commission Chairman Robert Mushen recommended the Port attach a letter submitted by Bornstein in August detailing his plans for the lease, make it part of the lease and require him to approach the commission if the company tries to change the use of the warehouse space.

The space Bornstein will expand into — 65 Pier 2 — is adjacent to existing space the company recently acquired

from Astoria Pacific Seafoods, a company co-owned by Andrew Bornstein's father, Jay.

"Bornstein's current intentions are to utilize this space as the primary location for the storing and staging of its packaging materials to support our growth initiatives of expanding processing capacity at the 'APS' building," Andrew Bornstein wrote in his letter last year. "This will allow us to not only add more jobs but purchase more fish from vessels, continuing on our path of ever increasing economic activity at both the Port of Astoria and in Clatsop County as a whole."

# Coast Guard rescues three kayakers near Seaside

SEASIDE — Three young men were rescued by the U.S. Coast Guard Wednesday night after their kayaks capsized on the Necanicum River near Seaside.

A Coast Guard Air Station Astoria MH-60 Jayhawk helicopter crew hoisted the men, ages 17, 18 and 20, to safety after they were stranded on a gravel bar in the river.

The men, who had symptoms of hypother-

mia, were taken to Seaside Airport and then to Providence Seaside Hospital, according to the Coast Guard.

"The Coast Guard reminds persons on the water to be prepared for an unexpected emergency by wearing proper gear like a wetsuit and life jacket," Lt. Chris Morris, a command duty officer at Sector Columbia River, said in a statement. "We remind everyone that the rivers and creeks are running fast due to the amount of rain that has hit the area, so caution is essential."

# Police identify man who jumped off Astoria Bridge

The man who died Tuesday evening after jumping from the Astoria Bridge has been identified as 67-year-old Carl Asplind of Bellingham, Washington.

"It is an unfortunate reality that on average 105 Americans die each day in the United States from sui-

cide," Astoria Deputy Chief Eric Halverson said. "While we were unable to prevent this tragedy, we hope that people contemplating suicide, know that there is hope and help for them."

One of those resources, Halverson said, is called Lines for Life, 800-273-8255 or www.linesforlife.org. It offers free confidential and

anonymous crisis help.

At about 6:37 p.m. Tuesday, Astoria Dispatch received a call from Asplind who said his van needed to be picked up from the bridge and that there would be a note explaining everything.

While Astoria Police responded, Asplind left the elevated area of the bridge and fell to his death.

Mike was born in Portland, Oregon, attended Central Catholic High School and graduated from Marshall High School. After high school, he enlisted in the Army and served in the Korean War.

Following his military service, he was trained at Bess Kaiser Hospital in Portland, Oregon, as a surgical assistant. He then entered the physician's training program at that hospital. Upon completion of the program, he was first employed at the Medical Dental Center in 1974.

In his spare time, Mike became the team medic for the football and baseball teams at Astoria High School, and coordinated sports physicals for all sports there.

In 1977, he married his sweetheart, Vicki Smith. They remained married for 39 years, and have one daughter, Kallie Meno, who resides in Seattle, Washington.

In the late 1990s, Mike and his family moved to Ilwaco, Washington. He built the North Beach Clinic in Klipsan, Washington. He practiced for 16 years on the Peninsula. During this time, he was mayor of Ilwaco for one term, and an active member of the city council.

He returned to Astoria in 2005, and worked locally for Dr. Thomas Duncan in Astoria, Urgent Care in Seaside and Urgent Care in Astoria until his retirement in 2015.

His awards include being in the Astoria High School Hall of Fame, Man of the Year for the Long Beach Grange, and he was a member of the Astoria Clowns.

He is survived by his wife, Vicki; his daughter, Kallie; his sister, Sue Snider (Dan), and brothers Paul Meno (Cathy) of Portland, Oregon, and Jeff Meno of Bend, Oregon; and several nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Eleanor Meno and Michael Meno II, and his brother, Harry Meno.

A celebration of life will be held Sunday, April 3, from 1 to 3 p.m. at The Loft at the Red Building, 20 Basin St., Astoria, Oregon.

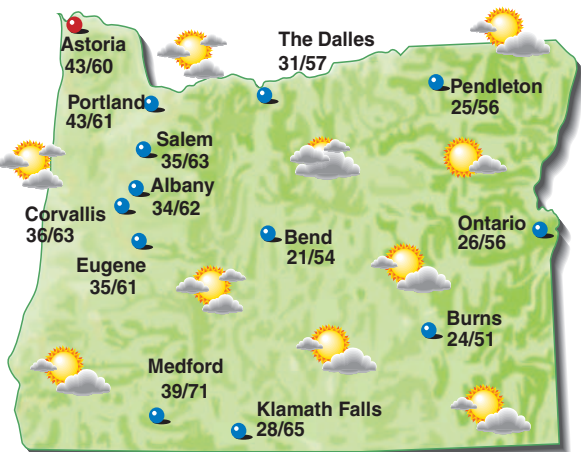

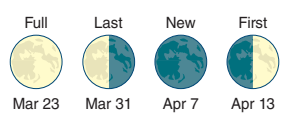

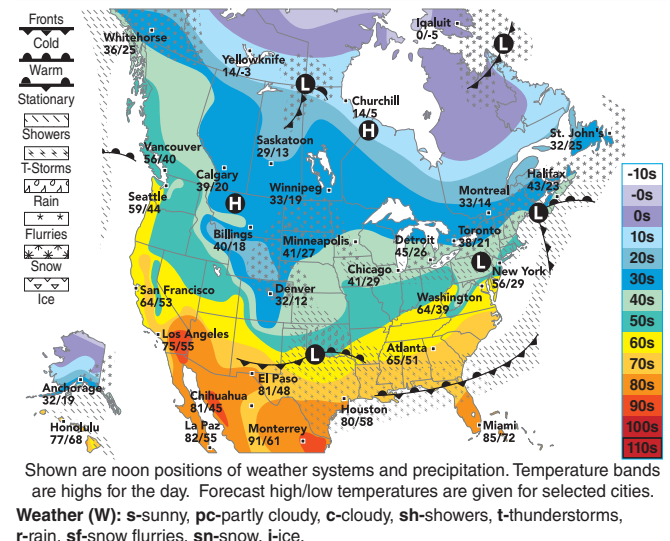
