

# Gulls finish tourney with 22-11 win

## Astoria takes Naselle to task

There were no shortage of runs Monday and Tuesday at Broadway Field, where the Gulls hosted their annual spring break softball tournament.

Most games featured both teams scoring in double-digits, with the host Seaside team scoring a total of 51 runs over three games, while Astoria went 3-0 and outscored the competition 55-11.

A typical game was Tuesday night's contest between Seaside and Naselle, won by the Gulls, 22-11.

Brittany West and Paige Ideue both had two-run doubles in the third inning, helping Seaside build a 17-3 lead.

Sophomore pitcher Jetta Ideue was solid in the circle in her three innings of work for the Gulls, who took advantage of multiple errors by the Comets to score most of their runs.

Jetta Ideue scored on a bunt in the first inning, as the throw to first went in to right field, allowing Ideue to circle the bases for a quick 2-0 lead.

Seaside finished the tournament 2-1, as the Gulls prepare for nonleague games next week vs. Estacada and Corbett.

The Lady Fish opened Tuesday's action with a 26-3 win over Woodburn; and about 11 hours later, they finished it off with a 20-1 victory over Naselle.

Neither game was much of a battle for Astoria, which held a 10-0 lead over the Comets after one inning of the tournament finale.

Astoria senior Mykka Abrahams is on an early-season hitting rampage, as she drove in five runs in the win over Naselle with a ground rule double that scored two runs in the first inning, and a three-run homer in the second.

Pitcher Rylee DeMander allowed just two hits in her four innings of work, while Abi Danen, Libby DiBartolomeo and Caitlyn Hougham each had two-run base hits at the plate.

Taylor Mickle reached base in her first three at-bats, and drove in a pair of runs.

### Valiants 9, Warriors 8

Valley Catholic of the Cowapa League outlasted Warrenton of the Lewis & Clark League Tuesday afternoon in the Seaside tournament, 9-8.

Valley Catholic's Zoe Burridge drew a leadoff walk in the bottom of the seventh, stole second and third, then raced home with the winning run on a ground ball out.
