WARRENTON — Warrenton played for the first time in 11 days, and showed no signs of a layoff Tuesday, as the Warriors cruised past Country Christian 11-1 in a nonleague baseball game at Huddleston Field.

The Warriors scored runs in each of their first three at-bats,

while pitchers Joe Little, Dalton Knight and Gavon McFadden allowed just three hits with eight strikeouts, with Little picking up the win.

Derek Halvorsen had a leadoff double for Country Christian in the top of the first, but was stranded at third.

Gavon McFadden had a leadoff double for the Warriors in the bottom of the first,

took second on a sacrifice bunt by Justice Watson and later scored on a wild pitch.

Little sprinted home on a ground-out by Hunter Wilson later in the inning.

Warrenton's Derek Ham led off the second inning with a single and later scored on an error for a 3-0 lead, and the Warriors tacked on three runs in the third inning.

Little had a leadoff double, Wilson added a one-out single, and a sacrifice bunt by David Foster was misplayed by the Cougars, who threw the ball into right field, allowing two runs to score and Foster to reach third.

Anthony Cochran and Ham each had run-scoring singles in a four-run sixth inning to give Warrenton a 10-run lead.
