

## Gulls fly past Warriors in twinbill

SEASIDE — Seaside crossed the plate 28 times Thursday afternoon at Broadway Field, on its way to a 19-3, 9-5 doubleheader sweep over Warrenton in nonleague softball action.

The Gulls had 19 hits in the opener, while Warrenton outthrew Seaside 8-5 in Game 2.

Seaside pitcher Jetta Ideue scattered six hits in the first game, in which the Gulls scored 12 runs in the bottom of the first, then added six in the second for an 18-2 lead.

Whitney Westerholm had three of Seaside's five hits, including two doubles, and drove in two runs in the nightcap.

Warrenton's Tyla Little and Landree Miethe both had triples in Game 2, and Miethe scored twice.

Ideue struck out 10 batters with no walks and four hits allowed.

### Tigers sweep Astoria

Astoria is still ranked No. 5 in the latest Class 4A softball rankings, but that didn't stop Clatskanie from posting a pair of upset wins Thursday over the Lady Fishermen.

The Class 3A Tigers defeated Astoria 12-3 and 5-4 in a doubleheader at CMH Field, as the Fishermen prepare for the Cowapa League season.

Taylor Mickle was 2-for-3 with a double in both games for the Lady Fishermen, who were missing key players — including five starters — from the lineup.

McKailyn started and pitched all of Game 2, in which the Tigers rallied with four runs in the fourth inning.

Astoria opens league play Tuesday at Tillamook, followed by a home doubleheader vs. Scappoose next Friday.

## Gulls continue to lower scores

WARRENTON — The Seaside boys golf team scored its second team victory in four days at the Astoria Golf & Country Club, with a Cowapa League dual match win over Astoria Thursday.

The Gulls shot a season-low team score and improved to 2-0 in Cowapa League play with a 329-398 victory in golf's version of the Clatsop Clash.

Seaside's Aaron Richardson was medalist with an impressive 3-under par 69. Teammate Berkley Posalski was second (82), followed by Jackson Kunde (86), Josef Barbic (92) and freshman Samson Sibony (108).

Kirk Fausett led Astoria with a 92. Other Fishermen scores were Ron Schumaker (98), Brian Wilder (101), Kyle Meisner (108) and Taylor Palmberg (113).

Richardson started out as hot as the weather, as he was just a putt away from birdieing the first four holes. He had five birdies on the front nine for a 32, then added a sixth birdie on the 11th hole.

After a double bogey on the 15th, Richardson chipped in from off the cart path for an Eagle on the 16th.

When his slippery 6-foot downhill putt caught the right side of the hole on the 18th, he ended the day with a career-best 69.

"Aaron had a great round today," said Seaside coach Jim Poetsch. "I think Carter Lee's 69 (for Tillamook) on Monday really motivated him today. Aaron has worked hard to be one of the best players in the state, and seeing that 69 on Monday reminded him that there are

other really good players out there.

"Today he just went out and focused from start to finish and showed what he is capable of doing."

Posalski shot five strokes better than his previous career-best score for the Gulls, while Kunde carded a season best score for the two-time defending state champions.

"We had a pretty good team score today too," Poetsch said. "(A) 329 will beat most teams on most days. But we can't rest our laurels on shooting a low score in April. We have some things we can still improve upon and our guys are working hard to get better every day."

Seaside's junior varsity team edged Astoria, 491-493.

## Warriors track scores wins in Portland

PORTLAND — The Warrenton track team traveled to Portland Thursday, to take part in a 4-Way league meet hosted by Portland Christian.

While the Portland Christian girls and Clatskanie boys recorded team victories, the Warriors had a number of first-place finishers with multiple personal records.

As always, the Warrenton boys scored most of their points in the throws, where Eli Petersen won the shot put with a toss of 41 feet, 4 inches, ahead of teammate Devon Bowser (39-4 1/4). Petersen placed second in the discus (97-6), while Tyler Whitaker won the long jump with a leap of 19-7, in a field of 30 competitors.

Whitaker was also second in the 300-meter hurdles (44.69

seconds), helping the Warrenton boys place third in the team standings behind Clatskanie and Portland Christian.

The Warrenton girls finished sixth, with wins from freshman Cailin Bennett in the 400 meters (1:12.75) and the 1,600-meter relay foursome of Fernanda Alvarez, Bennett, Taylor Owens and Sophia Thomas (4:48.68). Owens took second in the 300 hurdles (54.72).
