

# Fishermen hang on for 4-3 win

Astoria pitchers Jackson Arnsdorf and Carter Wallace limited Rainier to just two hits, while a pair of two-run innings held up for the Fishermen in a 4-3 win over the Columbians, in Saturday's baseball game at CMH Field.

Astoria improved to 6-5 overall, while the Columbians — the No. 3-ranked team at the 3A level — drop to 5-2.

Arnsdorf started and worked

five innings, allowing two hits with eight strikeouts and four walks. Wallace took over in the sixth and did not allow a hit.

Offensively, the Fishermen had eight hits off Rainier pitcher Mason Schimmel, who had five strikeouts and two walks in six innings.

Kyle Strange had a two-run single in the second inning, and Astoria tacked on two more in the third on an RBI single from Sambyo Tuimato and a fielder's choice.

# Lady Loggers back in championship form

KNAPPA — Slowly but surely, the Knappa Lady Loggers are beginning to look like their league championship team of a year ago.

Despite losing two of three games to Gaston last week, the Loggers were the clearly the better team. Their pitching and hitting has improved, and coach James Nichols has one of the best defensive teams at the Class 2A level.

The Loggers split the Northwest League doubleheader on their home field Friday. Gaston took Game 1, 6-5, before the Loggers bounced back with an 8-5 victory.

And now the tough games are in the past for Knappa, for the time being. The Loggers are 5-9 overall, but their next six league games are against Delphian and Nestucca, a combined 0-9 in league).

“Those were our two best games of the year, by far,” said Knappa coach James Nichols. “We’re hitting the ball better, Paris (Vanderburg) has really improved her pitching, and our infielders are making some big plays.”

“Laicee Hendrickson did a great job at third, and Hannah Hellberg had a great day at first,” he said. “I just wish Mikayla Rethati (left after Game 1 because of an illness) had felt better, because she’s become one of our better hitters.”

Knappa had a combined 17 hits on the day, with three from catcher Kaitlyn Truax in Game 1, and the sophomore had two more in Game 2, including a double. Hendrickson also had two hits in the nightcap, as did Alisha Murphy.

Meanwhile, the backstop took a beating, as two Gaston pitchers were tossing countless wild pitches into the net, with errant throws by the infield and passed balls by the catcher allowing Knappa base runners to circle the diamond all day.

It almost cost the Greyhounds Game 1.

Gaston built a 5-0 lead through five innings, before Knappa scored five runs in the sixth inning on four hits, three

Gaston errors, three passed balls and two wild pitches.

It all started when Gaston pitcher Charity Hall failed to handle a slow roller back to the circle, allowing Murphy to reach base.

Vanderburg and Emma Taggart followed with back-to-back singles, and after the Greyhounds recorded the second out (still with no runners having scored), Murphy sprinted home on a passed ball with the first run of the inning.

Vanderburg scored on a wild pitch, and Katie Patterson scored on a single by Hellberg. Hendrickson reached on an error, and the Greyhounds tossed the ball into right field for a second error, allowing Hellberg to score and Hendrickson to circle the bases for the tying run.

Gaston finished with 10 errors on the day, twice committing two errors on the same hit.

But to the Greyhounds' credit, they answered with a run in the top of the seventh, as freshman Brooke Jordan had a leadoff triple and scored the go-ahead run on a single by freshman Morgan Johnson.

The Greyhounds somehow managed to work their way out of a Logger rally in the bottom of the seventh.

Murphy drew a one-out walk, stole second, and took third on an error, which allowed Vanderburg to reach base. Truax singled to load the bases with one out, but Hall struck out the next batter, and a pop fly was caught for the final out.

Gaston had 13 hits, but stranded 11 base runners in

Game 1, while Vanderburg struck out six batters with one walk. Truax had three of Knappa's eight hits. Hellberg had the only RBI for Knappa.

The Lady Loggers picked up where they left off to start Game 2 — and so did the Greyhounds.

Murphy had a one-out single to right in the bottom of the first, advanced to third on two straight passed balls, then scored on a triple by Vanderburg.

The next batter, Truax, sent a ground ball through the legs of the Greyhounds' shortstop, and also through the legs of a Gaston outfielder, allowing Truax to reach third.

Truax scored moments later on a single by Hendrickson for a 3-0 lead.

Murphy scored on another passed ball in the second inning, and Knappa tacked on three runs in the fourth on one hit, two errors, two walks, two wild pitches and a passed ball.

“The win was big, because Gaston is going to be one of the main team we’re competing with,” Nichols said, along with Vernonia.

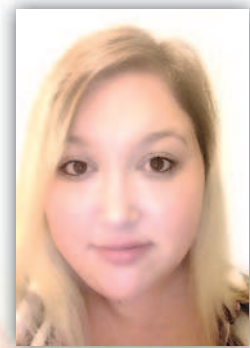

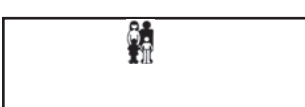
