Patrick Joseph Doyle

Warrenton

March 12, 1934 — April 10, 2016

Patrick Joseph Doyle was born March 12, 1934, in Spokane, Washington, where he was educated in the local Catholic schools. After high school he entered the Jesuit novitiate, remaining with the Jesuits 11 years without ordination, and obtaining a bachelor's degree from Gonzaga University.

He began his teaching career at Bellarmine High School in Tacoma, Washington. After leaving the Jesuits, he moved to Astoria, Oregon, where his brother-in-law, Joe Nerenberg, offered him a job as a salesman at Hildebrand's Furniture Store. There he met his wife, Rose Marie Lyons, a high school teacher and librarian at Star of the Sea. They were married June 13, 1966.

After their first child was born they moved to Gearhart, where Pat took a job at Gearhart Grade School. For the next 14 years he taught in all the grade schools in the Seaside School District, and in the summer worked in construction for local builders.

He then decided to follow his father's footsteps and become a cross-country trucker. After three years, he concluded he needed to be home with his family of (then) nine children. He took a job as resident adviser at Job Corps, and then as a teacher, for the next 13 years. He ended his professional teaching career at the Oregon Youth Authority, where he taught until his early 70s.

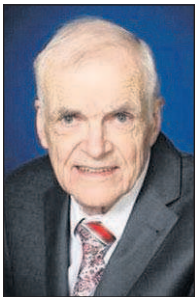
Pat and Rose Marie raised 12 children, and were generous in sharing their large home in Clatsop Plains with others needing shelter and guidance. Pat was also a respected Bible teacher in the local Christian community.

Ann Marie was born in Portland on Jan. 23, 1939, and passed away surrounded by the love of family and friends on April 7, 2016. Ann was known for her elegance and artistic talents.

She graduated from the University of Oregon and attended the Boston School of Art, where she majored in sculpture and met and married her first husband, Alan Ridley. Together they traveled across country in a 1939 Chevrolet coupe.

She and Alan divorced, and, later, she married the son of the proprietor of her favorite San Francisco antiques store, Leland "Stack" Hayward. They resided in Fort Bragg, California, and moved to Astoria, Oregon, in 1979 to be closer to Ann's family and that of her good friend, Sharon. Stack passed away in 2005.

Ann married Charles Stuart in a romantic seaside wedding on July 31, 2014. That love they shared will sing as long as stars shine. They lived in Chinook, Washington, for a while and then moved to Astoria where they lived at the Columbia House condos.

Ann was predeceased by her mother and best friend, Marion Volz. Ann unflinchingly cared for her mother and Stack during their prolonged final illnesses. After this, she indulged her love of diverse cultures by traveling the world with her friend, Nancy Williams. They explored Turkey, China, Bali, Japan and Vietnam, where she developed her deep appreciation of Asian art.

Sculptor Stanley Wanlass engaged Ann to assist him with the bronze at Fort Clatsop,

which commemorates the Lewis and Clark journey. Her art was shown many times in various galleries. Ann's artistic energy was evident in the exquisite indoor and outdoor living environments that she created with attention to Asian arts. Her garden is a spectacular example of her eye for design and beauty as well as her knowledge of plants, which she learned from her mother, a passionate gardener. Additionally, many enjoyed her exquisite matting and framing talents as a longtime employee at The Compleat Photographer.

Known to her friends as the "cat whisperer," Ann volunteered at the Clatsop County Animal Shelter, where she was the matchmaker of humans and animals. She also volunteered on the Women's Resource Center hotline for several years.

Ann Marie is deeply missed by her husband, Charles Stuart; cousins Kam McCallum Geshner and Gabriella Heinsheimer Geshner, and their son, Lucky Vita Geshner; stepdaughters Nicole Stuart (Mark Duntmann) and Alena Dryden (John Dryden); her stepgrandson Jacob Meeks; and the numerous friends who hold her dear in their hearts. Ann touched the lives of her community, and she was irreplaceable.

Ann's memorial will be held at a later date. Friends and family will be notified of the arrangements.

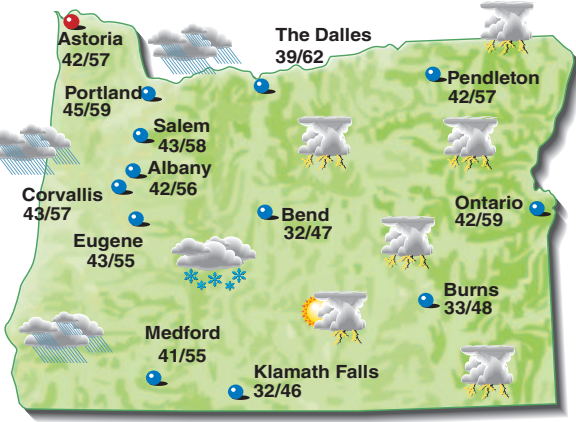

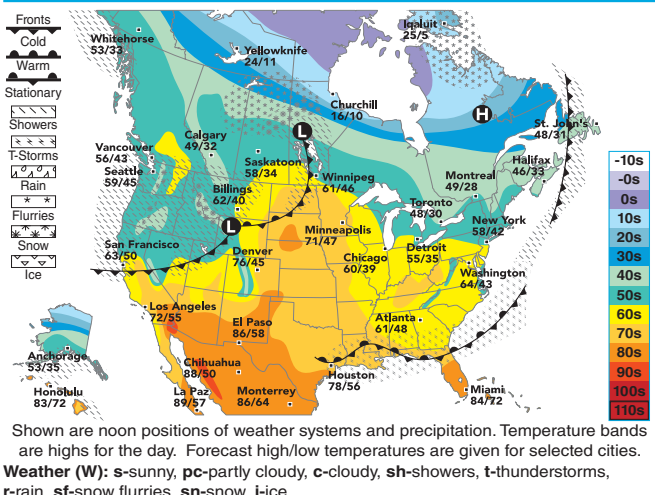
