On Sunday, a local group of mountain bike riders, the North Coast Trail Alliance (NCTA) came together to clean up garbage and debris around the forest roads in the "Pipeline" area, which is currently owned by the Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF).

Two Seaside High School students, Taylor Barnes and Hunter Thompson also showed up to pitch in.

The NCTA will be working with ODF to flag and build trails in the area. The goal is to build fun and exciting trails, and to make this area a destination for mountain bike travelers and locals alike.

The group worked with Mark Kalar of Recology Western Oregon, and a 20-yard

dumpster was donated and hauled up to a central location, where it acted as a home base for the volunteers, who drove their trucks out into the various spur roads of the forest system to gather trash. Within a few hours, the entire dumpster was full of everything from dishwashers and couches, to vehicle transmissions and several bags of garbage.

The Rusty Cup donated coffee to get the group going in the morning, and Fort George Brewing was there with beer when the work was finished. "It's awesome what a group of energetic, inspired people can accomplish," Morgan Soller, president of the NCTA, noted on Facebook. "(It's a) huge step towards shredding (mountain bike trails) at home. Good job, crew!"




