"Walter was born in Astoria, Oregon, to Frank Fransen and Hilja Eskola Fransen on Nov. 13, 1923. He grew up in Astoria (Church Hill and Uniontown area), and always said it was a great place for kids to grow up. The Depression was at its peak, but everyone was in the same fix, and we all ate a lot of fish.

"Walter went to Capt. Robert Gray School and graduated from Astoria High School in 1942, just in time to enter the Navy in 1943. He said the years in the Navy were just as good as a college education. After boot camp and quartermaster school, he returned to Astoria to go aboard the CVE 85 — USS Shipley Bay, which


married in Pendleton, Oregon, her home town.




