

Ideue puts in long day for two wins

SEASIDE — Seaside's Jetta Ideue pitched all 14 innings of a doubleheader Friday at Broadway Field, in a 5-1, 13-6 sweep over Valley Catholic in Cowapa League softball action.

Ideue threw a total of 193 pitches on the day, as she gave up nine hits and struck out 11 batters with just two walks in the two seven-inning games.

The Gulls came out swinging in the opener, scoring four of their five runs in the first inning.

Whitney Westerholm and Ideue both had RBI doubles, and Brittany West also drove in a run. Westerholm was 2-for-2 with a pair of doubles, while Jetta Ideue had a double and Paige Ideue added a triple.

Seaside pounded out 17 hits in Game 2, and led 10-6 after three innings.

West was 3-for-4 and scored twice, and the Gulls had six doubles, two by Mica Paramal, who drove in three runs. Seaside improves to 7-5 overall, 2-1 in league.

TILLAMOOK — Tillamook outthit Seaside 12-11, but the Gulls took advantage of their scoring opportunities to post an 11-7 Cowapa League win over the Cheesemakers Friday at Tillamook.

Seaside's Astor Landwehr drove in four runs on three hits for the Gulls, while pitcher Brent Walsh picked up the win, despite giving up 11 hits in 4 and 1/3 innings. Dylan Wallis got the save, striking out three in 2 and 2/3 innings.

Dawson Blanchard was 3-for-5 with three

RBI's and two runs scored. Jake Bassett scored three times and had a triple for the Gulls, 1-3 in league.

Rainier sweeps Warrenton

WARRENTON — Mason Schimmel tossed a no-hitter in Game 1, and Rainier built a 4-0 lead through two innings of Game 2 Saturday afternoon, as the Columbians swept a doubleheader at Warrenton, 24-0 and 7-2.

The Warriors committed a combined 15 errors on the day, nine in Game 1. Only seven of the Columbians' runs were earned.

Schimmel struck out 10 batters with just one walk in his Game 1 no-hitter. Rainier held a slim 3-0 lead through three innings, before scoring 10 runs in the fourth and 11 in the fifth.

Warrenton outthit Rainier in Game 2, 6-4, but errors late in the game helped the Columbians pull away.

Anthony Cochran and Gavon McFadden each had a double for Warrenton. Warrior pitcher Dalton Knight scattered four hits with five strikeouts and one walk.

Knappa wins two by forfeit

Knappa won two games and took over sole possession of first place in the Northwest League, all without stepping on the field.

Delphian forfeited both games of a doubleheader against the Loggers Friday. Knappa's

two 1-0 victories puts the Loggers in first place, following Neah-Kah-Nie's doubleheader split with Vernonia.

WARRENTON — Rainier's softball team scored a pair of shutout wins at Warrenton Saturday, 12-0 and 20-0.

Pitcher Sarah Probasco tossed a no-hitter in the opener, striking out 12 with one walk.

Still, the Columbians led just 1-0 through five innings, as Warrenton's Niqui Blodgett made her season debut on the mound and held Rainier in check.

Rainier finally broke through with 11 runs in the top of the sixth, finishing with 13 hits and taking advantage of five Warrior errors.

The Columbians led 17-0 through three innings of Game 2. Blodgett had Warrenton's only hit (a double) off Rainier's Haley Schimmel, who struck out nine with no walks.
