





Astoria Visual Arts and Recology Western Oregon have created the Coastal Oregon Artist Residency, which will provide local artists the chance to make pieces from recycled, repurposed and discarded materials recovered from the Astoria Recycling Depot and Transfer Station.

The project is meant to encourage people to conserve natural resources and promote new ways of thinking about art and the environment.

Each three-month residency will provide access to discarded materials, a stipend of \$400 per month and a large studio space at the recycling center. During their residen-
