

Seagulls drop two games by 5-4 scores

TILLAMOOK — Coming off a one-run loss at Astoria earlier in the week, the Seaside softball team dropped two more one-run games Friday at Tillamook, 5-4 and 5-4.

The Gulls out-hit the Cheesemakers in both games of the Cowapa League doubleheader, but Seaside left 14 runners on base in Game 1, and Tillamook rallied late to win Game 2.

Seaside's Whitney Westerholm and Jetta Ideue had three hits apiece in the opener, in which the Gulls took advantage of seven walks and three hit batters by two Tillamook pitchers.

The Mooks snapped a 2-2 tie with three runs in the fifth inning, before the Gulls rallied with two in the top of the seventh before the final out was recorded.

Tillamook rallied from a 4-1 deficit in Game 2 by scoring four runs in its final three at-bats.

The Gulls scored three runs in the first inning, which opened with a single by Paige Ideue. Brittany West scored on a grounder by Emma Dutcher.

Once again, Seaside's Jetta Ideue had the better pitching numbers (six hits allowed, seven strikeouts, one walk), but Tillamook's Taylor Browning (eight hits allowed, one strikeout, one walk) got the win.

Trailing 4-2 entering the sixth inning, Tillamook tied the game on a two-run double by Jennifer Tuatagaloa, scoring Makinley Johnson and Lexie Zuercher.

The Cheesemakers scored the game-winner in the bottom of the seventh, when Zuercher's two-out single to left scored Kaja Smith.

Hageman adds another school record

SALEM — The Astoria girls track team can dominate the big meets, too, as the Lady Fishermen demonstrated Saturday afternoon in the Willamette Valley.

Astoria won seven different events in the annual "Meet of Champions," held at Willamette University in Salem. The Lady Fish added a number of top five showings in other events, as they tune up for their post-season run.

Astoria scored most of its wins in the field events.

In the throws, junior Skadi Freyr won the shot put with a toss

of 40-feet, 1 inch, and also took second in the javelin; and teammate Halie Korff placed second in the discus.

Sophomore Darian Hageman once again swept the four jumping events, clearing 5-2 in the high jump; leaping 17-4½ and 38-1 to win the long jump and triple jump, respectively, and clearing a school record 11-0 in the pole vault.

On the track, sophomore Kaylee Mitchell took first in the 800 meters (2 minutes, 16.54 seconds, just missing her school record of 2:16.51); and Astoria's quartet of Gracie Cummings, Victoria Kee, Kaylee Mitchell and Natalie Cummings had the

best time in the 400-meter relay (50.87).

Freshman Gracie Cummings added a second place in the 100 and a third-place in the 200 meters; and freshman Nara Van De Grift was second in the 300-meter hurdles.

The Astoria boys recorded a victory of their own, as junior Lucas Caruana won the 1,500 meters in 4:12.25, in addition to taking second in the 800 (2:03.97).

Seaside's Bradley Rzewnicki won the 3,000 meters in 9:10.14; and the Gulls' foursome of Taylor Barnes, Jackson Januik, Will Garvin and Juneau Meyer took second in the 1,600-meter relay.

Timely hits missing in Warrenton DH loss

PORTLAND — The timely hits belonged to Catlin Gabel Friday, and so did most of the runs in a 6-1, 4-1 sweep over Warrenton, in a Lewis & Clark League baseball doubleheader in Portland.

Catlin Gabel built a 5-0 lead through three innings of Game 1, then scored single

runs in the first, fourth, fifth and sixth of Game 2 to score the victories.

"We didn't play poorly — we just couldn't come up with the timely hits and pitches when we needed them," said Warrenton coach Lennie Wolfe, "and (the Eagles) did."

Catlin's Patrick Muskat had a three-run homer in the opener, while Gavon McFad-

den, Ka'leo Kapua and Dalton Knight all had doubles for the Warriors.

Warrenton's Derek Ham had a double in Game 2, helping the Warriors out-hit the Eagles, 7-5.

Muskat threw 88 pitches, and struck out eight with one walk in a complete game for Catlin Gabel, which had no errors on the day.

Logger win streak hits 40

STAYTON — The Knappa Loggers are coming up on two years since their last loss, and through 13 games of the 2016 season, no team has been able to challenge their current win streak, which hit another milestone last week.

The victory string has now reached 40 in a row, as the No. 1-ranked Loggers mowed down Regis 19-7 in a nonleague contest, Friday in Stayton.

Despite giving up a season-high seven runs, the Loggers scored 19 of their own (11 in the fourth inning) on 16 hits, seven for extra bases.

Knappa's Mason Hoover had two doubles and drove in five runs, and teammates Noah Kinney and Jason Miller (4-for-5 with a triple) added three RBIs apiece.

Rueben Cruz was 2-for-2 with a double and three RBIs.

One of only two unbeaten teams left in Oregon high school baseball (Class 3A St. Mary's is 18-0), the Loggers have given up just 16 runs in 13 games this season, the fewest at any level. Horizon Christian (3A) is the next closest, having given up 30 runs in 11 games.

Knappa will try to extend its 55-game win streak in league play this week, when the Loggers play three games vs. Nestucca.

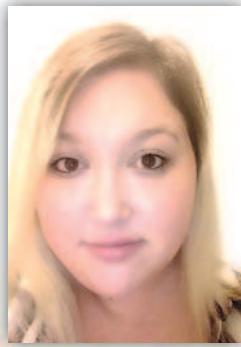
