Peter Archie Anderson Real Estate Emeritus Aug. 23, 1942 — April 24, 2016

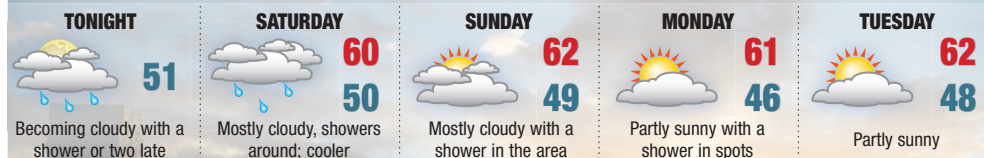

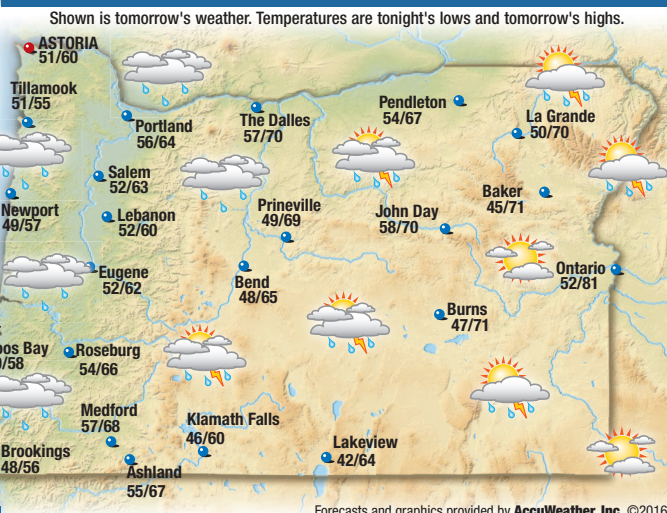
FIVE-DAY FORECAST FOR ASTORIA

Tonight's Sky: The first quarter moon is at 10:02 a.m.

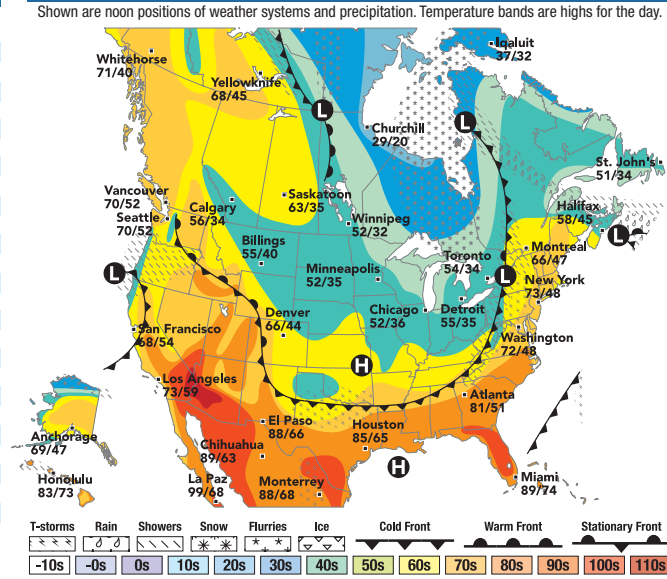
