
the primary because the U.S. Postal Service cannot guarantee on-time delivery for ballots postmarked after Thursday. Voters who want to participate in the primary must cast their ballots at one of the dropoff sites around the state or at a county clerk's office.

Drop-off locations are posted on the websites of the Secretary of State's Office and county clerk's offices. Ballots may be dropped off at any county clerk's office in the state, regardless of the voter's place of residence. The county clerk who receives the ballot will mark it as submitted on time and deliver it to the county clerk's office where the voter is registered to vote.

· Election workers have already processed nearly 25 percent of ballots in the state, but the votes will not be tallied until after the May 17 deadline. In the meantime, processed ballots are stored electronically in card readers, Burgess said.

"If we start releasing numbers, it might alter the way people vote," Burgess said.

• A small percentage of ballots cannot be processed, because voters either neglected to sign their ballots, or their signatures don't

match their voter registration

In Multnomah County, less than 1 percent of the 110,000 ballots received by Friday

lacked signatures or have mismatched signatures, said Eric Sample, spokesman for the county's elections division.

Challenged ballots are sep-

arated from the rest, so that county clerk's offices can reach out to those voters to add a signature or resubmit a signature. Many of those

votes will be counted after deadline. County clerks have until June 6 to compile and certify results. That includes counting what is expected to be an unprecedented number of write-in votes, said Molly Woon, Secretary of State spokeswoman.

• Earlier this month, the Secretary of State's Office warned that voters who changed their party affiliations close to the April 26 voter registration deadline might receive two ballots. The issue occurs because county clerks across the state begin to prepare ballots for mailing two weeks before the registration deadline. After the registration deadline, clerks send out smaller batches of ballots to the group of people who changed their registration close to the deadline.

Voters should use the ballots that reflect their most recent registrations, which in many cases is the second ballot that arrived in the mail, according to the Secretary of State's Office.

"It's normal for our county clerks to receive a late flood of party registration changes in the days leading up to a pri-mary election," Secretary of State Jeanne Atkins said in a written statement earlier this

Val Unger, Polk County clerk and president of the Oregon Association of County Clerks, agreed. "It's that interesting anomaly that happens every primary election," Unger said.

Unger said county elections workers will identify any instances of a voter turning in two ballots, because there is a bar code on every ballot.

When a voter sends in the first ballot issued under their previous party registration, elections workers will set it aside and wait to see if the voter turns in the second ballot that reflects their current registration. In these cases, elections workers will only count the ballot with the voter's current party registration.

If a voter only sends in a ballot issued under the previous party registration that is no longer correct, elections workers will make a copy of that ballot that only includes the voter's choices in nonpartisan races.

"They should at least get to vote on something, so they'll get to vote on the non-partisan races or candidates," Unger said. "But we do hold it in case they send the right one."

"It's really hard to avoid the second ballot issue," Unger said. "It's essentially impossible."
