Open house on Franklin Avenue improvements The Daily Astorian Marine Drive.

The city of Astoria and Columbia Memorial Hospital are hosting a public open house Thursday to discuss proposed improvements to Franklin Avenue between 23rd and 27th streets. Community members and interested parties are invited to drop in anytime between 6 and 7 p.m. The event will be held at the CMH Columbia Center at 2001

The hospital is constructing a new parking lot adjacent

to 23rd Street and Franklin. The lot will improve parking and pedestrian and vehicular mobility between 23rd and 27th streets. The project includes closing the currently vacated access on 23rd Street at Marine Drive, providing new sidewalks and crosswalks, improved drainage, a new turn lane on Marine Drive, and a

safer access to Franklin.

The project team expects to start construction this summer, and it is anticipated to be completed by early fall.

The hospital received funding for the improvements Marine Drive from a along state Department of Transportation access management grant. The hospital is providing the funding for the work planned on Franklin and the improved parking facility.
