Strange cloud formations over Astoria Tuesday afternoon had several residents talking and taking pictures. Representatives of the Portland branch of the National Weather Service concluded that the clouds are likely the remnants of a thunderstorm. "Interesting clouds formations/features are common with the type of weather pattern we had yesterday (areas of mid-level instability)," Will Ahue, a meteorologist with the weather service, wrote in an email. Observations from the Astoria Regional Airport show a thunderstorm near the airport at approximately 4:45 p.m. Tuesday afternoon, which supports the theory that the photo is of an old thunderstorm, he wrote.

# Astoria Dispatch selected as pilot site for new technology

Astoria Dispatch is one of six 911 centers in the state to be chosen as a pilot site for new technology to accept text messages, images and video.

Jeff Rusiecki, Astoria Dispatch manager, said the aging system will be replaced with an updated network. The dispatch center will be able to take a variety of information from sources other than telephones.

The updated network, known as Next Generation 9-1-1, replaces the existing narrowband, circuit switched network,

which carries only voice and very limited data. Next Generation 9-1-1 allows the dispatch center to accept building plans and medical information data, along with texts, images and video.

The network is also expected to be more flexible in communication across county, state and international boundaries.

A fully featured, standards-based Next Generation 9-1-1 system will be implemented in successive steps, Rusiecki said, and is likely several years away.

The pilot project is the first step.

Astoria Dispatch has already been in a testing phase to accept text messages. The dispatch center is using a webbased Windows application operated by a third-party provider, TeleCommunication Systems.

The center anticipates going live in August with accepting text messages.

"It's a combination of having the right technology, training, and policies and procedures in place," Rusiecki said. "Only then can we begin to embrace these technological improvements."

# Seaside man sentenced for wild police chase

High on drugs, he assaulted deputy's wife

The Seaside man who was high on methamphetamine and heroin when he led police on a chaotic chase last fall through a Cullaby Lake

neighborhood was sentenced Tuesday to more than two years in prison.

Donald Allen Sanders, 35, eluded police, crashed into a yard, broke into a deputy sheriff's home and assaulted the deputy's wife before being arrested.

He pleaded guilty last month to first-degree burglary, fourth-degree assault, fleeing or attempting to elude a police officer, recklessly endangering another person and driving under the influence of intoxicants. He was sentenced in Clatsop County Circuit Court to 28 months in prison and five years probation. If he violates probation, he would face an additional five years in prison.

"While my intention was not to hurt anybody or put somebody's life at risk, I know I can't take that back," Sanders said. "There is nothing I can do to take it back."

The police chase began Oct. 6 when Sanders sped through Seaside traveling at about 70 mph in a 25 mph zone. He headed northbound on U.S. Highway 101, reaching speeds of more than 90 mph.

Sanders then barreled through barricades, went over lawns and drove down walking paths in the Cullaby Lake neighborhood. He caused more than \$1,000 in damage.

At one point, he stopped and tried to steal a Clatsop County Parks Department

pickup truck, but the keys were not inside the vehicle so he returned to his 1995 Nissan Maxima.

Sanders crashed near Deputy Steve Johnson's house and ran on foot straight into the home. He was met by Johnson's wife, Kelly Johnson, and

slammed her into the corner of a wall. She suffered injuries to her neck and back.

Deputy Johnson and Warrenton Police Chief Mathew Workman were able to arrest Sanders. They found tar heroin and a knife in his possession.

When asked why he ran into the house, Sanders told police he was trying to find another set of car keys so he could get away. He said he ran into the deputy's wife and did not mean to hurt her.

"The defendant was extremely high on methamphetamine, rambling about being chased by somebody that wanted to kill him because he stole their drugs," Chief Deputy District Attor-

nev Ron Brown said.

Kelly Johnson, who works for the District Attorney's Office, spoke at the sentencing hearing.

She described enjoying the day with her husband, 3-year-old son and 6-week old daughter before Sanders barged in the house. She remembers having to push her son out of the way so he would not get hurt. Her son still has nightmares and asks if the bad man is coming back.

"My children were placed in a dangerous situation all because of you," she told Sanders.

Deputy Johnson spoke in court about how his home is his only sanctuary away from work. When Sanders broke into his home, the deputy had to set down his infant daughter and grab Sanders to arrest him.

"You violated my one and only sanctuary. You put my family at risk. You traumatized my wife and my kids," he said. Judge Philip Nelson

Judge Philip Nelson reminded Sanders how much worse the incident could have turned out. Sanders could have struck and killed a pedestrian or another person in a vehicle while speeding through the community.

Deputy Johnson was also well within his rights to have killed Sanders. The deputy showed great restraint that many others may not have shown, the judge said.

"I don't know if the right word is 'lucky," Nelson said. "You are certainly lucky or fortunate to be here today."

chosen in primaries and caucuses. That's notable because Sanders has argued that his White House bid remained viable as long as he stood a chance of winning a majority of those delegates. He would have needed a landslide Tuesday to reach that goal.

Sanders is under intense pressure from top Democrats hoping to coax him gently out of the race, win over his voters and turn to the task of challenging Trump.

Despite the pledge to sol-

ider on, there were signs Sanders was listening. In his typically passionate remarks, the socialist firebrand repeatedly noted "we are in this together" and argued that a tenet of his campaign was that "we will not allow rightwing Republicans to control our government."

Sanders said he called Clinton to congratulate her on the victories

The senator planned to return home to Vermont on Wednesday, before coming to Washington Thursday for meetings and a campaign rally

campaign rally.

President Barack Obama

called both Sanders and Clinton late Tuesday, congratulating both on their campaigns. The White House said Sanders and Obama would meet Thursday, at Sanders' request, to discuss "how to build on the extraordinary work he has done to engage millions of Democratic voters, and to build on that enthusiasm."

Clinton and Sanders are also expected to connect in the coming days, Clinton's spokesman said late Tuesday. Their campaign managers spoke earlier in the day, signaling that conversations were underway about the road ahead.

#### Suspect in Elma crimes captured in Seattle

SEATTLE — Seattle police have arrested a man wanted in connection with the death of a man whose body was found outside a burning home in Elma.

KOMO-TV reported police arrested 37-year-old Jacob Eveland Tuesday after spotting a stolen pickup truck Eveland was thought to be driving. Police say Eveland first gave them a false name but later con-

firmed he was Eveland.

The Grays Harbor County Sheriff's Office responded May 31 to a shots-fired call in Elma. Authorities say they found Eveland's house engulfed in flames and a 47-year-old man's body.

The man had been occu-

pying the home with other acquaintances, authorities said. The victim reportedly was assaulted with an edged weapon and a firearm.

Eveland will be transferred and booked at Grays Harbor County Jail for investigation of murder and arson.
