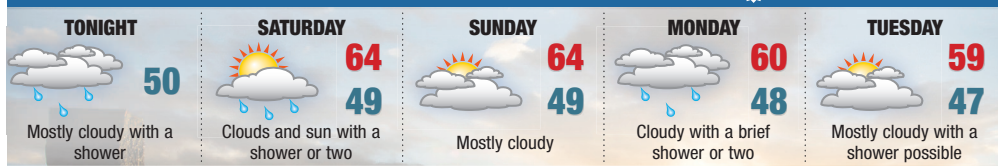

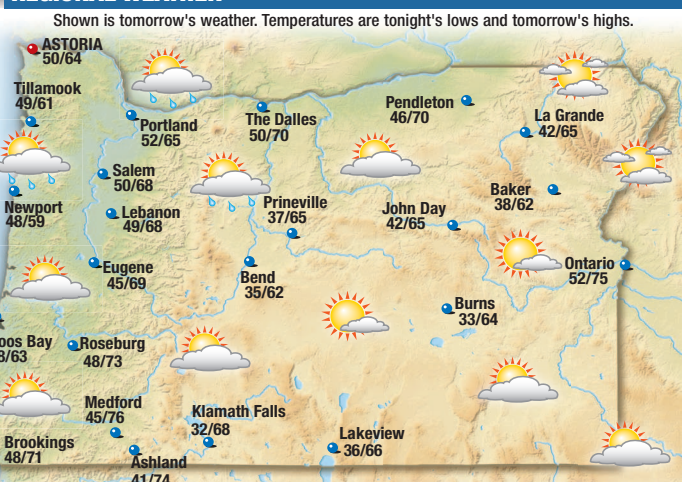

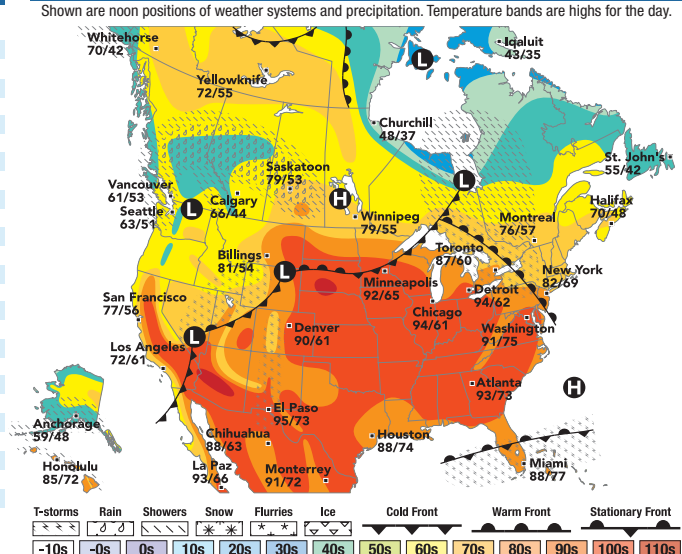

Annabel Margaret Myers

Astoria

Oct. 29, 1925 — June 4, 2016

Annabel Margaret Myers was born in Greenleaf, Kansas, on Oct. 29, 1925, and died on June 4, 2016, in Astoria, at the age of 90. In between was a life lived to the fullest.

It included a lot of travel, learning, teaching, loving and being loved by many who knew her. She grew up in Kansas, living through the Great Depression. After graduating from high school she enrolled in a training school run by Eastern Airlines, and spent the years during World War II working as a radio operator for the airline. After the war she worked for a time as a travel agent, which may be where her lifelong love of travel began.

In 1950 she married John David Myers, and over the next seven years had three children, John Reed, Bruce Edward and Lorraine Ann. In 1961, she and her children moved to Eugene and began life in Oregon. Newly divorced, she had to raise three kids during a time when single mothers were rare. But, in her words: "I (had) to play the cards that life dealt me with as much skill, grace and joy as I could muster. Furthermore, I intended to do it with as much pizzazz as possible."

And so she did: earning a master's degree in curriculum and instruction at

the University of Oregon; leaving Eugene in 1970 to take a job as dean at a private school in New Hampshire; traveling to West Africa for five months with her kids; moving to Astoria in 1973 and taking a job at Tongue Point Job Corps; serving for a couple of years on the Clatsop Community College Board; and working for the Experiment in International Living taking students to Greece and Ghana.

After retiring in 1980, she spent the next 24 years traveling to Mexico for the fall and winter seasons, then heading back to Astoria for spring and summer. She spent her final years in her small house close to the Columbia River reading and learning more about her passion for the sciences: physics, archeology, geology, biology and math.

She is survived by her three children, two grandchildren and two great-grandchildren, as well as three brothers and a sister. Her family would like to acknowledge their profound gratitude to the home hospice team who helped and guided them during her final days. Remembrances can be made to Lower Columbia Hospice, 2111 Exchange St. Astoria, OR 97103.

A memorial service will be announced at a later date.
