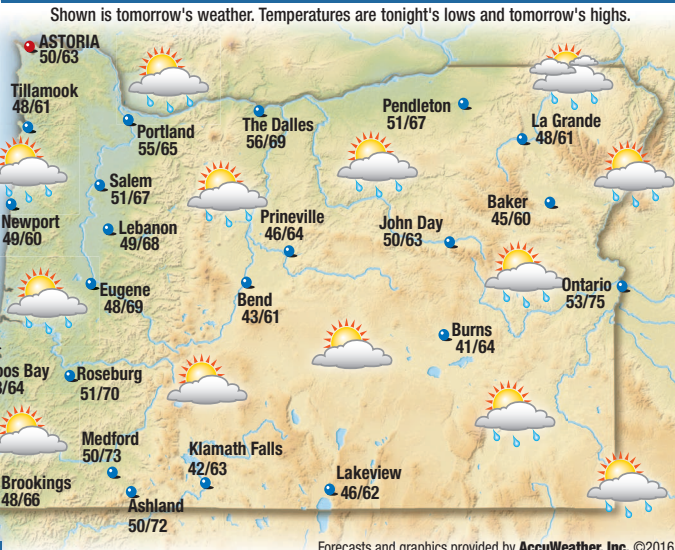

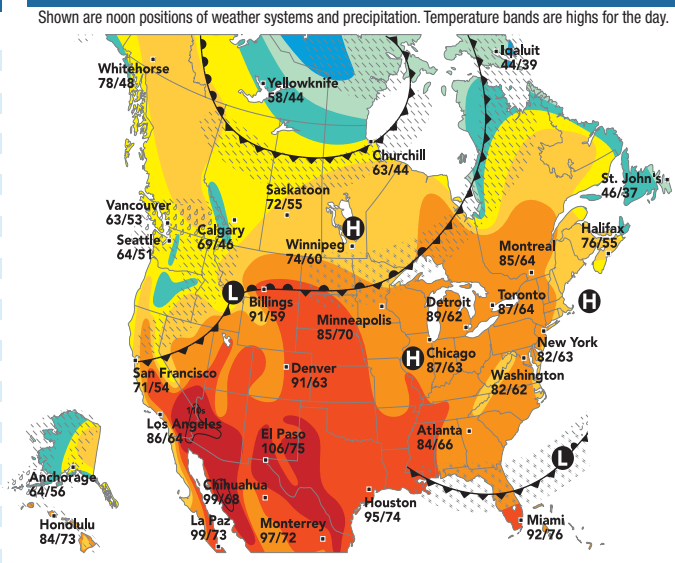

### Joseph Francis 'Nemo' Rubens Sr.

Hammond

July 30, 1926 — June 11, 2016



Joseph Francis Rubens Sr. of Hammond, Oregon, was born in Dahlia, Washington, on July 30, 1926, to Arthur Theodore Rubens and Agnes Henry Rubens. He died at home in Warrenton on June 11, 2016. He was 89 years old.

A lifelong resident of Hammond, he attended local schools after returning from four years of Naval Service (joining when he was 17 years old) in the Pacific Fleet during World War II. He was a part of JASCO, which was the Joint Assault Signal Company (communications). He served as radioman on the ships USS Brush and USS DuPage-APA 41, Attack Transport, in the Philippines, China and Japan.

One of the most vivid memories of his service was when he was aboard ship off the coast of Wakayama, Japan, preparing to invade, and he copied the message on Aug. 6, 1945, that the atomic bomb had been dropped on Hiroshima, and the war would soon be over.

He worked at Point Adams Cannery in Hammond, Oregon, and in Alakanuk, a native fishing village on the Yukon River in Alaska, where they developed the fish oil used in canning fish. Returning to school, he was certified as an electrician, and worked at the family business at Warrenton Electric.

For many years, he was a self-employed farmer and cattleman with his business, JB Herofords, raising and breeding organic beef. He served as the president of the Clatsop County Livestock Association, and was a life member of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks (BPOE). He was an avid salmon fisherman and outdoorsman, and enjoyed many long forages for local foods, especially razor clams and small wild blackberries, and yearly hikes up Saddle Mountain.

A lifelong member of the Chinook Tribe, he strongly supported the recognition of tribal legal status with the federal government.

He was preceded in death by his brothers Raymond Rubens of Hayward, California, Chris Rubens of Newberg, Oregon, and Arthur Theodore "Bud" Rubens of Hammond, Oregon, who died during the Battle of the Bulge in France; and sisters Louise "Lula" Soderberg Taylor of Taylor's Island, Washington, Kathleen Mansfield of Blaine, Washington, and Carolyn Petersen of Hammond, Oregon.

A wonderful devoted father and husband, he is survived by his wife, Bettie Marie, married in 1947 for 69 years; and children Joseph Rubens Jr. of Vancouver, Washington, Rebecca Rubens of Astoria, Oregon, and Kenneth Rubens of Portland, Oregon; niece Carolyn Shepherd of Hammond, Oregon, and numerous nieces and nephews and cousins; grandchildren Noah Bell of Portland, Oregon, David Rubens of Vancouver, Washington, Nicole Schwartz of Sandy, Oregon and Jill Salemno of Philadelphia; six great-grandchildren; and one great-great-grandchild.

The family would like to express profound thanks to Lower Columbia Hospice staff and volunteers, who provided so much needed support and comfort in Nemo's last weeks.

The service will be handled by Ocean View Crematorium, with a private family celebration of life and blessings at "Chicken Point" in Hammond following soon, as weather permits.
