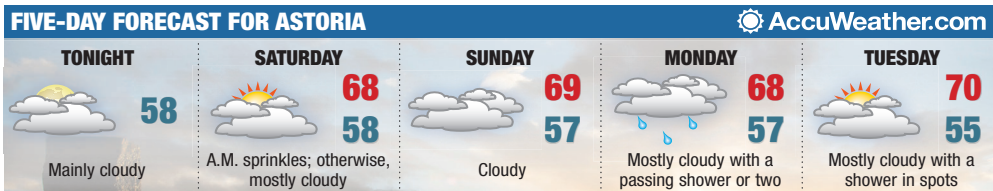
### Crash

Tonight's Sky: The Andromeda Galaxy is low above the northeast horizon before midnight.

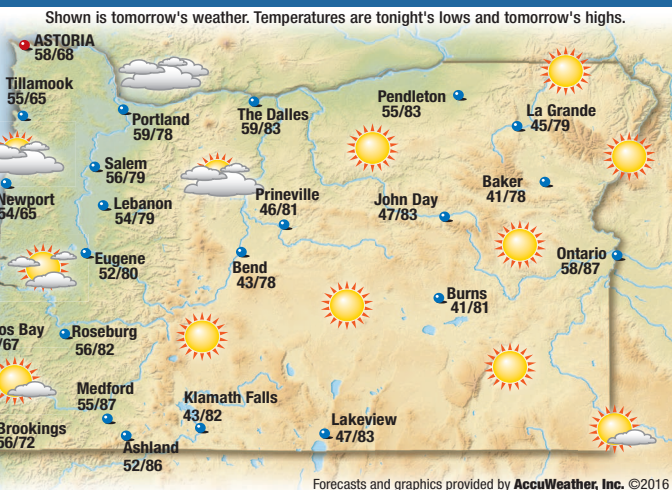

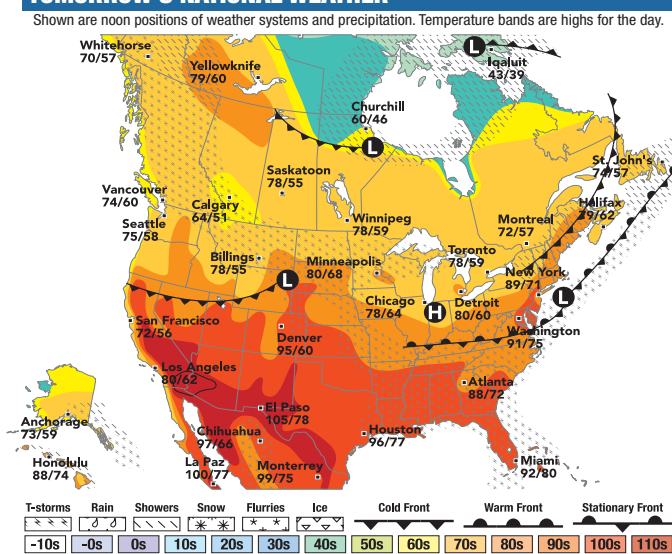
