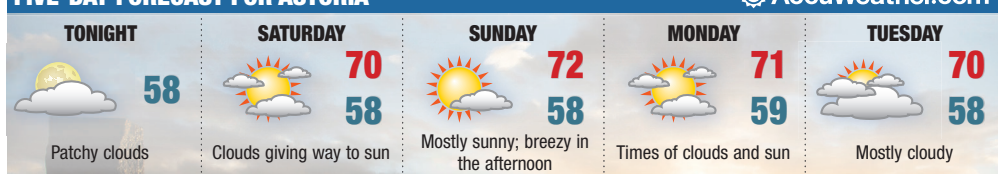

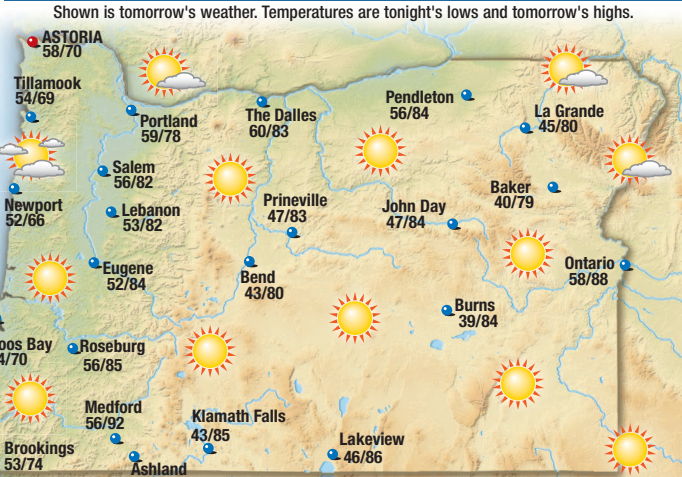

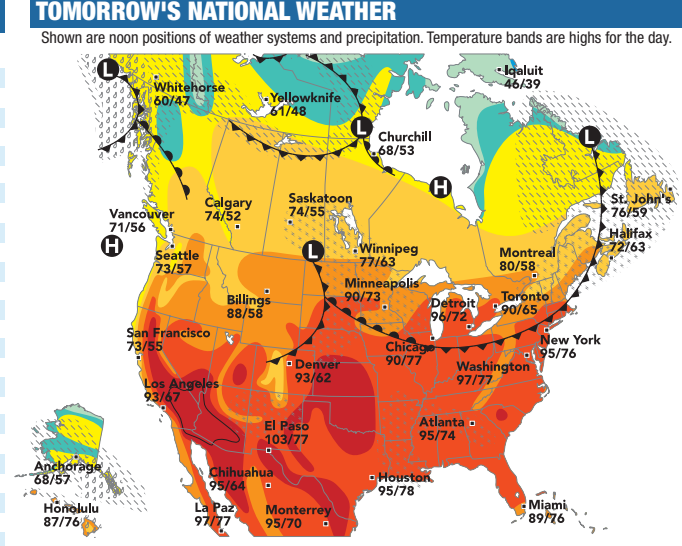

Steven Carl Albin Wilson

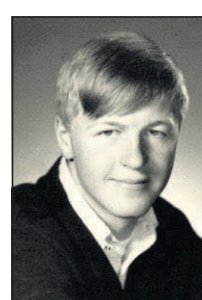
