Clatsop Behavioral Health provides comprehensive services at its offices in Astoria, Warrenton, and Seaside, including 24/7 crisis coverage. Our Astoria location has two suites in the Park Medical Building at 2120 Exchange Street. Suite 203 provides adult outpatient services for both mental health and addictions with open access times on a first come/first serve basis. Suite 301 provides both psychiatric and Youth and Family services with scheduled appointments available.

We also have full service locations at 316 S. Holladay in Seaside and at our Premarq Centre location in Warrenton, 65 North Highway 101, Suite 204. CBH provides services for those with Developmental Disabilities in Suite 210 at the Premarq Centre. Other programs and services provided are Early Assessment and Support Alliance (EASA), free gambling treatment services, and our Open Door Program provides Supported Employment, Acute Community Treatment, and Peer Support services.

Most Office Hours: 8am to 7pm Monday through Friday. Clatsop Behavioral Healthcare bills most commercial insurance plans, Medicare and Medicaid and offers a sliding fees based on income.

They lived in the back of the store for seven years. While Jean rented rooms in the hotel and operated the gift shop, Bud worked two jobs: selling cars at a local Ford dealership and selling furnaces for an oil distributor.

A few years after they opened the gift shop, the Ter Hars added clothing to their inventory, and soon they became a clothing store.

Because the apartment was, according to Bud "too valuable a space to be living in," the Ter Hars moved in 1958 to a house in Gearhart, where Jean continues to live. Bud died in 2009.

The clothing store with the black-and-white awning was torn down when Trendwest Inc. bought it and other property they owned along Broadway and the Prom in 2001 to build its condominium resorts. The Ter Hars became owners of the first floor of the building and not only continue to operate their store in a Broadway storefront, but rent out other storefronts to businesses all the way to the Prom.

In addition to the Seaside store, they have operated stores in Astoria and Long Beach, Wash. In 1991, the Ter Hars opened the Cannon beach store, which continues to operate today.

In total, the Ter Hars own six commercial buildings that have 34 different businesses operating in them. All of the properties are in Clatsop County.

Jean and Bud always believed in reinvesting in Seaside by opening other storefronts. This gives people opportunities to prosper in business.

Besides their financial investment in Clatsop County, however, the Ter Hars also invest their time in the community. They often can be seen supporting athletic teams and other student organizations in the Seaside schools. Bud, Peter and Jeff have had associations with the Seaside Downtown Development Association and The Seaside Chamber of Commerce (all three had a turn as Chamber President).

With the business Jean, Jeff & Pavi are able to work and contribute with the Assistance League Columbia Pacific to help clothe the children in the county. Pavi is an active member in Assistance League.

"It's important not only for us to let our customers have a good shopping experience, but we're also like a mini chamber of commerce," Jeff said. "People need to know we have an aquarium, a two-mile Prom and where to get seafood."
