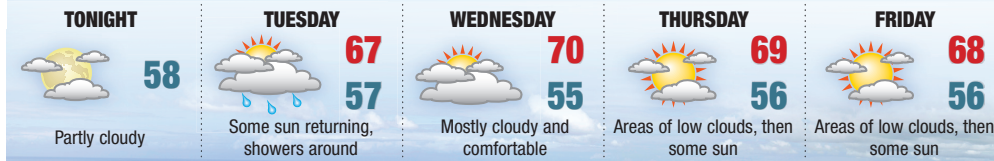

EO Media Group earns 44 Oregon awards

The Daily Astorian won the Jerry Latham Mail Tribune Award for the highest increase in circulation of any daily newspaper in the state at the Oregon Newspaper Publishers Association's Better Newspaper Contest July 22 at a convention in Silverton.

In total, newspapers in EO Media Group brought home 44 awards.

In addition to the Latham Award, the Astorian won first place for best special section or issue for Our Coast 2015, with Editor Rebecca Sedlak, designer John Bruijn, photographer Joshua Bessex and staff named. Bessex also won second place in the sports photo category for "Come sail away" and second for best fea-

Former Daily Astorian managing editor, Patrick Webb, took second in the best sports story category for "Captains Positive."

For best graphics, EO Media Group graphic artist Alan Kenaga earned second place for the Astorian for a stormwater treatment upgrade plan.

Reporter Erick Bengel took third in lifestyles coverage for Goonies fans turn out for bonfire.

For best Page 1 design, the Astorian took third with Matt Vann, Laura Sellers and Derrick DePledge listed.

The Astorian competes against all Oregon daily newspapers with circulation of 10,000 or less.

Kitzhaber talk won't veer from health care policy

PORTLAND — Former Gov. John Kitzhaber will speak in Portland Monday, continuing his effort to reenter public life since resigning his elected office more than a year ago amid a federal influence-peddling probe.

But if you go hear him speak at First Congregational Church in downtown Portland, don't count on hearing a lot about Kitzhaber's departure from Mahonia Hall. The public's questions at the City Club forum called "Healthcare in the U.S. — Are we ready for more reform?" will be lim-

ited to the topic at hand, says Mike Marshall, the City Club's executive director.

"It's out of deference to all of the panelists and all of the people coming who want to talk about health care," Marshall said.

Other speakers at the 3 p.m. event include Don Berwick, former administrator of the federal Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services; Alisha Moreland-Capua, executive director of the Avel Gordly Center for Healing at Oregon Health & Science University; and Dr. Paul Gorman, an OHSU professor and single-payer advocate who will serve as moderator.

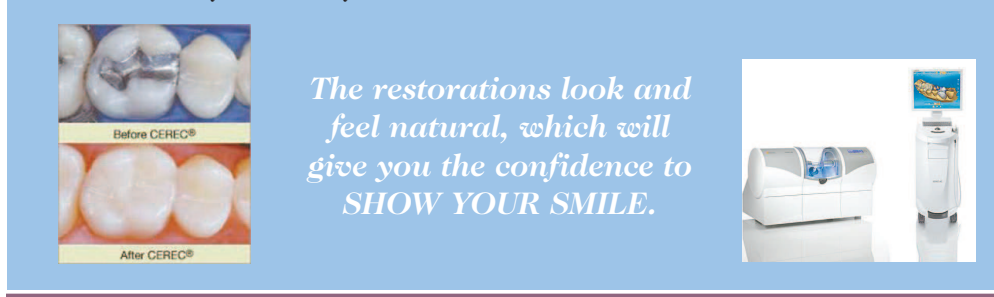
