There will be a graveside service with family and friends in September.



PORTLAND mer Gov. John Kitzhaber will speak in Portland Monday, continuing his effort to reenter public life since resigning his elected office more than a year ago amid a federal influence-peddling probe.

But if you go hear him speak at First Congregational Church in downtown Portland, don't count on hearing a lot about Kitzhaber's departure from Mahonia Hall. The public's questions at the City Club forum called "Healthcare in the U.S. Are we ready for more reform?" will be limited to the topic at hand, says Mike Marshall, the City Club's executive director. "It's out of deference to all

of the panelists and all of the people coming who want to talk about health care," Marshall said. Other speakers at the 3 p.m.
